## SB 535 - An act concerning credit unions; pertaining to field of membership; pertaining to mergers; pertaining to branches

The Chair asked Ken Wilke, Revisor, for an overview of the balloon amendment on <u>SB 535</u>. Following Mr. Wilke's overview and a period of questions, answers, and discussion, the Chair called on Doug Wareham, Kansas Bankers' Association, for his comments.

Mr. Wareham provided a document showing credit unions whose current geographic field of membership must be reconfigured, the metropolitan statistical areas of Kansas City, Topeka and Wichita, the total population of the Kansas City MSA and common border counties, the total population of Topeka MSA and common border counties and the total population of Wichita MSA and common border counties. Following questions of Mr. Wareham, Marla Marsh, Kansas Credit Union Association, commented on behalf of the credit unions.

The Chair thanked the credit unions and banks for their cooperation and hard work on this bill.

Senator Wilson moved the passage of the amendments to SB 535. Senator Brownlee seconded. Motion carried.

Senator Wilson moved to pass out favorably Substitute SB 535 as amended. Senator Brownlee seconded. Motion carried.
