Moved by Representative Goyle, seconded by Representative George for approval of Minutes of the House Committee on Veterans, Military and Homeland Security held January 22, 2009 and January 27, 2009. Motion Carried.

Moved by Representative Goyle, seconded by Representative Phelps to request approval of the Senate confirmation of the Governor's appointees to the Kansas Commission on Veterans' Affairs. Motion Carried.

The Chairman introduced Mr. Jack Walker, Deputy to the Garrison Commander, Combined Armed Center and Ft. Leavenworth. Mr. Walker then introduced Military Students, Major David Farmer, United States Air Force and Major Richard Wellman, United States Army, both currently attending the Command and General Staff College, Ft. Leavenworth. Steve Noland, Strategic Communications Officer and Jeff Wingo, Public Affairs Officer, Ft. Leavenworth were also part of the delegation.

The Chairman thanked Representative Meier for arranging the visit of the Ft. Leavenworth guests.

Mr. Walker presented a power-point presentation (Attachment 1), depicting the history and functions of Ft. Leavenworth and the Combined Armed Center.

The Post was established in 1827 and is considered one of the most significant National Historic Landmark Districts in the United States Army. The Post population year around is over 118,000 and continues to expand. This includes military personnel, family members, employees, inmates, transient students and retirees. Currently a new regional confinement facility is being constructed to take care of inmates from other military facilities. Ft Leavenworth has the only military maximum security prison. A new chapel complex is also underway.

The Combined Armed Center lists priorities as Leader Development and Education; Comprehensive Approach to Operations; and Operating in the Information Domain..

The Command and General Staff College annually serves around 1800 individuals each year. This includes members of all United States Armed Forces and international military students. The cultural experience has been beneficial in developing foreign relations and the program continues to grow.

Questions and answers followed. Mr. Walker explained that the school district at Ft. Leavenworth is like other Kansas schools except it is a one-hundred percent impacted school district which enables Federal funds to flow into the state, like Junction City for example. He also said the Army is working to improve communication with other government agencies and is bringing in FBI and CIA agents and their students to see how the military works. .

Majors Wellman and Farmer spoke briefly about their military history. Major Farmer is a Kansas State University graduate and grew up in Chapman, Kansas. Major Wellman is a University of Kansas graduate and grew up in Wichita, Kansas.

The Chairman introduced Bonnie Templeton, Researcher of Kansas Veterans Missing in Action. (Attachment 2) The Chairman thanked Representative Craft for arranging the opportunity for Ms. Templeton to speak to the Committee. Ms. Templeton stated her interest in Vietnam Era Kansas Prisoners of War and Missing in Action (POW/MIAs) began when she purchased her first MIA bracelet in 1988. She gave personal accounts of the research she has done and families with whom she has visited. She furnished a visual aid with pictures of MIAs and a list of 56 POW/MIAs from Kansas of which 26 remain missing. (Attachment 3)

Questions and answers followed. Ms. Templeton said it is her understanding that the governments efforts in locating POW/MIAs are now focused more on MIAs.

Chairman Myers announced the next meeting is February 3. The Committee will receive a briefing from Adjutant General Tod Bunting, Kansas Director, Homeland Security and Emergency Management.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:30 p. m..

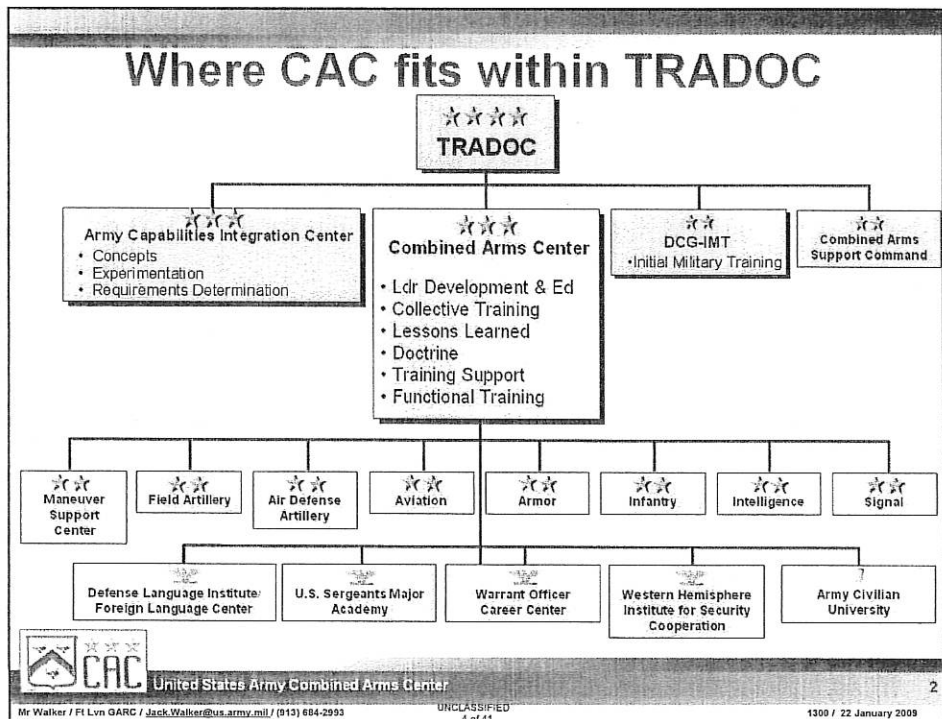

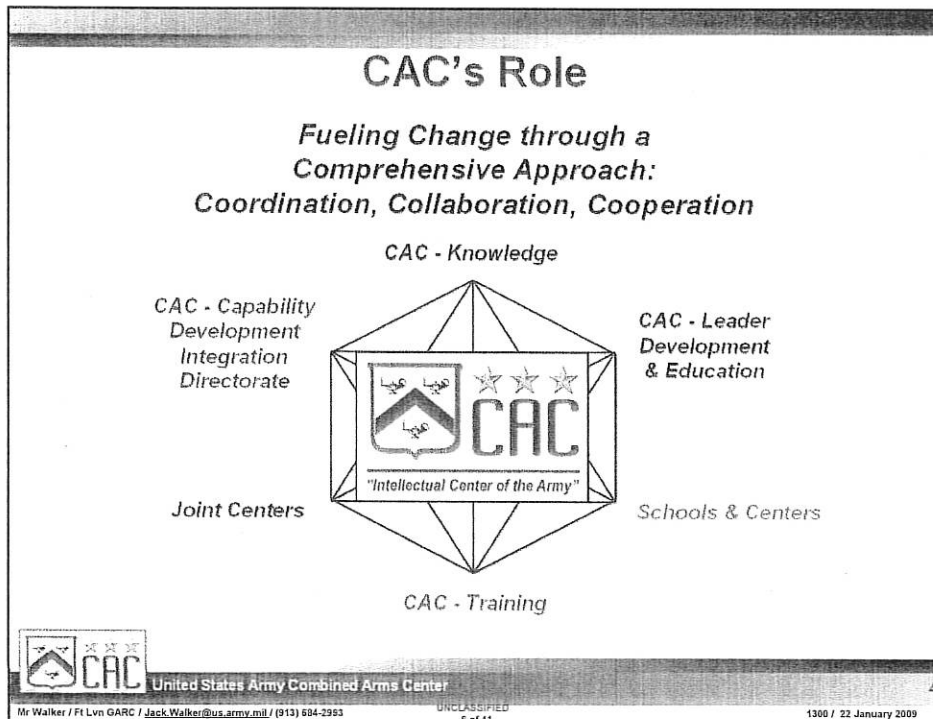
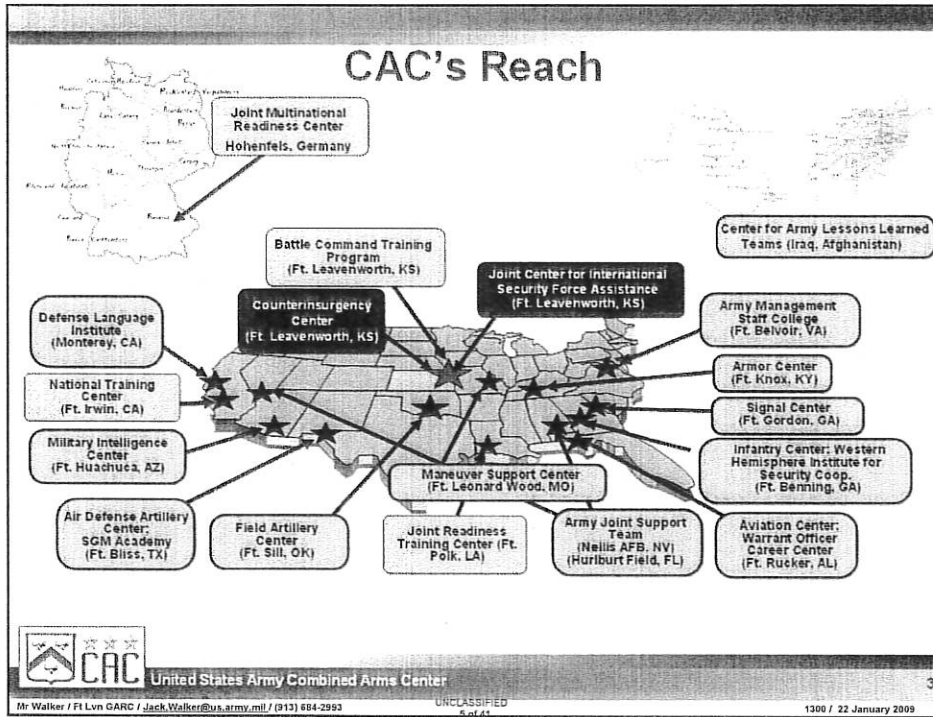

### *HISTORY*

#### Named for Colonel Henry Leavenworth

- 1827 – Post established
  - Oldest active Army post west of the Mississippi River
  - 30 miles northwest of Kansas City, MO
  - 5,634 Acres (8.8 square miles)
- 1866 – U.S. Congress authorized formation of four black regiments
  - 10<sup>th</sup> U.S. Cavalry Regiment established at Fort Leavenworth
- 1875 – The The U.S. Disciplinary Barracks (USDB) established
- 1881 – Gen. William T. Sherman established the School of Application for Cavalry and Infantry
- 1946 – School evolved in the current U.S. Army Command and General Staff College

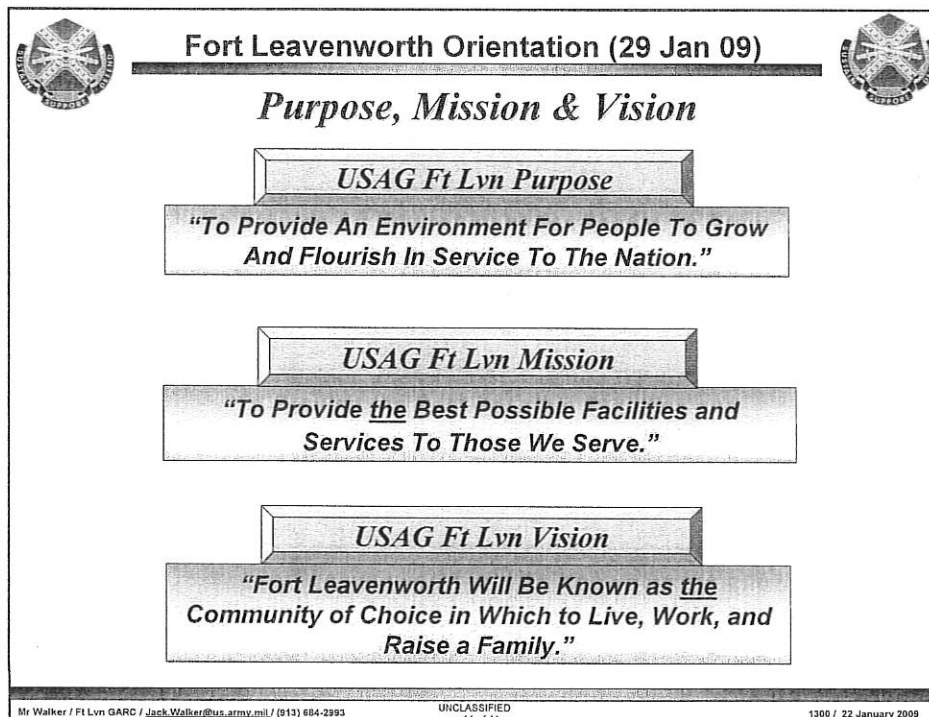
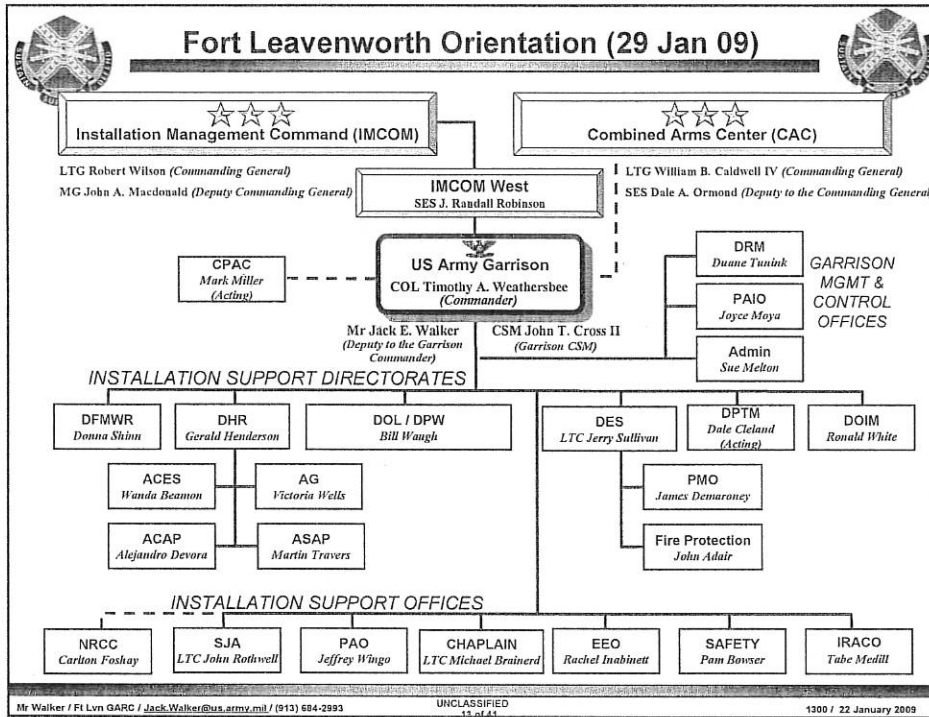


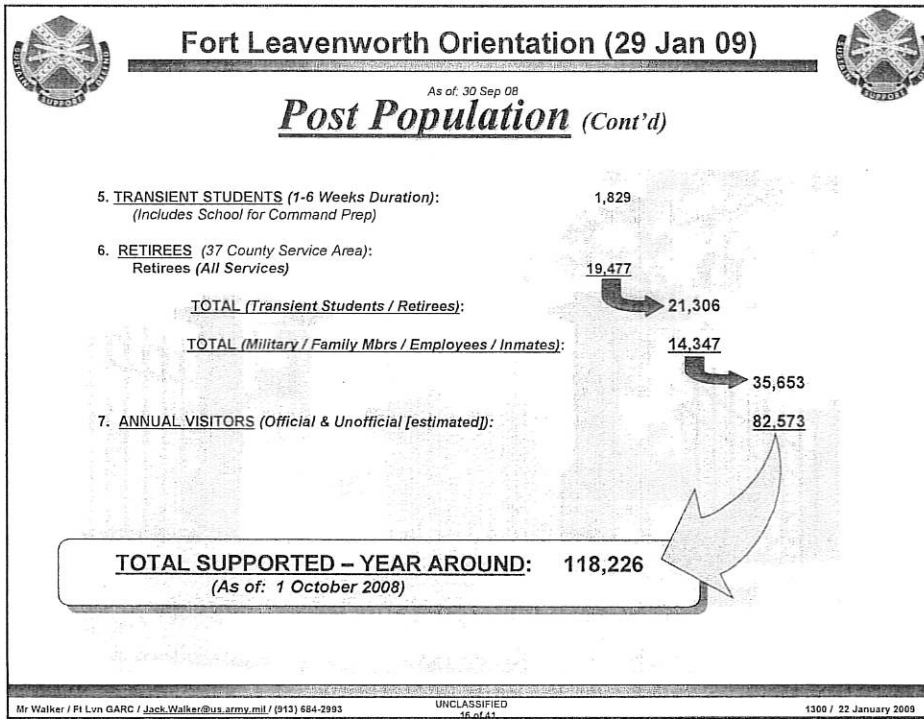
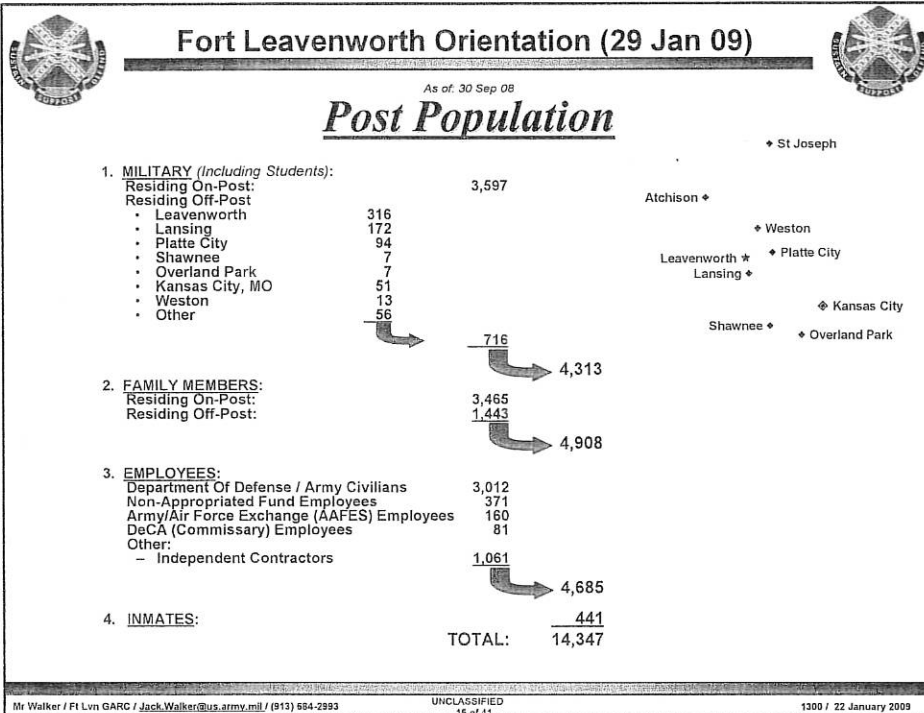

I want to say what a privilege it is to be asked to speak today and thank Representative Barbara Craft for inviting me. I have been involved with POW/MIA awareness since 1988 when I purchased my bracelet. I was at Ft. McClellan, AL for my Officer Advanced Course and saw a vendor selling the bracelets. I was looking for one with an Army Officer from Kansas. I found CWO Bobby Lyn McKain from Garden City and knew it was fate for his initials were the same as mine before I got married.

Bobby started me on a road which has enriched my life with some wonderful friendships. About two years after I bought his bracelet, I started wondering what he looked like and wanted to know more about him. The internet had the standard synopsis of his loss but not much else. I went to one site and got the list of all Kansans that were still listed as Missing in Action. There were 32 at the time. I started searching all the names and was amazed at the amount of information available for some and the lack of it for others. My goal at this time was to find a picture for each name. It took almost five years of traveling to town libraries and High Schools, getting records from the Library of Congress and posting messages on the Internet but I finally had a picture for each one.

During the time I was searching, the US Government was also still searching and finding our troops. Patrick Harrold of Abilene was identified in 1997. He had been missing since 1969 and never saw his son Tim. His wife Linda had stayed in the area, working on Ft Riley and just recently passed away. In 2003, Denis Anderson from Hope was identified; 2004, Jerry Hendrix from Wichita; 2005, William McGonigle from Wichita; 2006, Glenn McCubbin from Alma; 2007, George Long from Medicine Lodge and most recently and most important to me, Bobby McKain was identified and laid to rest in Arlington National Cemetery on 11 Aug 2008. In Nov, Kurt LaPlant from Lenexa was identified. In a twist of fate, I have known his cousin for 10 years and didn't know the affiliation until I mentioned it at a meeting.

In 1993 military officials found portions of a helicopter that matched the coordinates for Bobby's wreck. Eventually, using his brother Gib's DNA, fragments from a jaw bone, two teeth and an arm bone were identified as Bobby's. Bobby's co-pilot, Arthur Chaney, was also identified. In all, 18 Kansas soldiers have been identified and returned to their families.

The Joint Personnel Accounting Command or JPAC has the mission to

achieve the fullest possible accounting of all Americans missing as a result of the nations past conflicts. JPAC is located on Oahu, Hawaii. The laboratory portion of JPAC, the Central Identification Laboratory, is the largest forensic anthropology laboratory in the world. JPAC's day-to-day operations involves investigating leads and recovering and identifying Americans who were killed in action but never brought home. To date, the US Government has identified over 1300 individuals. At any given time, there are more than 1000 active case files under investigation. On the average, JPAC identifies about six MIAs each month but the recovery and identification process may take years to complete due to the numerous checks and balances in place.

Having grown up in an Army family and as a retired army veteran it is comforting to know that our government is still searching for and identifying our soldiers and making sure that no one is forgotten or left behind. I placed my Bobby McKain bracelet at the Wall in DC 26 January 2009 and visited his headstone in Arlington National Cemetery. I am now wearing a new bracelet for Charles Lee Hoskins. We share the same middle name and birthday.

As we go our separate ways, let us never forget to honor those who gave the ultimate sacrifice for their country and our freedom. Thank you for giving me the time to address your committee.
