Brief*

HB 2741 amends current law which makes it a crime to injure or kill a police or arson dog by adding "search and rescue dog" to the existing statute. "Search and rescue dog" is defined to mean a dog used by a law enforcement or emergency response agency for the purpose of locating persons missing in disasters or other times of need. Violation of the statute is a class A nonperson misdemeanor.

There was no testimony in opposition to the bill.
