**SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2823**

As Recommended by House Committee on  
Federal and State Affairs

**Brief\***

HB 2823 concerns drivers licenses. The bill would require male applicants between the ages of 18 and 26 to be registered in compliance with the requirements of the Military Selective Service Act to obtain a Kansas drivers license or identification card. Under this measure, by applying for a drivers license or identification card, the signature of these men would serve as an indication that they are already registered with Selective Service or that they authorize the Division of Vehicles to forward their personal information to Selective Service for automatic registration.

**Background**

Representative Cook testified in favor of the bill, as well as representatives of the Selective Service System and the Adjutant General's Department. There were no opponents.

The Director of the Division of Vehicles of the Department of Revenue testified that the Division already has a cooperative agreement with Selective Service to share data. Under KSA 74-2012(c)(1)(C), the Division may assist Selective Service in maintaining a list of men 18 to 26 years of age. Currently, the Division assists Selective Service by forwarding updates twice a year.

The Director of Vehicles stated that any increased administrative costs associated with HB 2823 can be absorbed within existing resources.
