SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2783

As Amended by House Committee of the Whole

Brief*

Sub. for HB 2783 by the House Committee on Appropriations, would limit, in the *Governor's Budget Recommendation*, the Governor's ability to transfer money from special revenue funds to the State General Fund that are not provided for in existing law. This would not eliminate all transfers from special revenue funds to the State General Fund as it does allow for all transfers authorized by statutory law to continue. An example of existing statutory law is the ability to transfer up to 20 percent of revenue to the State General Fund for services such as accounting, auditing, payroll, personnel and purchasing. It would not allow, for example, transfer of money from State Bank Commissioner's fee fund ending balance to the State General Fund.

Sub. for HB 2783 was amended by the House Committee of the Whole to not allow any provision or proviso in an appropriation bill to transfer money from special revenue funds to the State General Fund that are not provided for in existing law.

Background

The Chairman of the House Committee on Judiciary was the only conferee on this bill who spoke in favor of the bill. There were no conferees who presented testimony against the bill. Because this bill does not take effect until the FY 2006 budget cycle, there is not any fiscal note expected with this bill.

Sub. for HB 2783 was amended by the House Committee of the Whole to not allow any provision or proviso in an appropriation bill to transfer money from special revenue funds to the state general fund that are not provided for in existing law.
