SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON SENATE BILL NO. 60

As Amended by Senate Committee on Transportation

Brief*

SB 60 would amend the definition of "all-terrain vehicle" in two sections of transportation law. Under the bill, the definition of the term would mean any motorized nonhighway vehicle 48 inches or less in width, having a dry weight of 1,000 pounds or less, traveling on three or more low-pressure tires, and having a seat designed to be straddled by the operator. Specifically, the bill would increase the width from 45 inches to 48 inches and increase the dry weight from 650 to 1,000 pounds.

Background

This bill was requested by the Russell County Attorney. A spokes person from the Division of Vehicles appeared in support of the bill and recommended an increase in the weight limit (beyond what was contained in the original bill).

A fiscal note states that the Department of Revenue believes the bill would require minimal programming changes to the vehicle information processing system. The agency indicates that these expenditures would be handled within current resources.
