SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON SENATE BILL NO. 105

As Recommended by Senate Committee on Assessment and Taxation

Brief*

SB 105 would amend a local sales tax statute to ratify the results of a November 2004, election in Miami County relative to extending an existing quarter percent sales tax earmarked for road construction and improvement for an additional five-year period. The law also would be amended to clarify that Miami County has authority to seek voter approval of additional five-year extensions.

Background

The existing Miami County sales tax for road construction and improvement had been scheduled to sunset on December 31, 2005. County voters in November approved, by a margin of 63-37 percent, a ballot guestion seeking to extend the tax for an additional five years.

Proponents included Senator Apple, the Miami County administrator, and a Miami County commissioner.

The bill would not affect State General Fund receipts. County officials indicated that extension of the tax for the additional five-year period would be expected to raise an additional \$4.5 to \$5.0 million for road construction.
