SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2242

As Recommended by House Committee on
Governmental Organization and Elections

Brief*

HB 2242 would repeal the statute that required records of the Ombudsman of Corrections be confidential.

The bill was placed on the Consent Calendar.

Background

The Office of the Ombudsman of Corrections was abolished during the 2003 Legislative Session. The Secretary of Corrections provided written testimony in favor of the bill, explaining the statute was no longer needed. No others appeared to testify.

A fiscal note issued stated passage of HB 2242 would have no fiscal effect.
