SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON SENATE BILL NO. 554

As Amended by Senate Committee on Transportation

Brief*

S.B. 554, as amended, would require all driver's licenses issued to individuals under the age of 21 to expire on the holder's 21st birthday. The bill also would charge \$18 to a person 21 years of age or older for a commercial driver's license; \$20 for a Class A,B,C, or M farm permit issued to a person less than 21 years of age; and \$3 per year for any renewal of a license issued prior to the effective date of the act to a person less than 21 years of age.

Background

The conferee who testified in support of the original bill included the representative of the Kansas Licensed Beverage Association. The conferee from the Driver License Examining Bureau said that the agency had worked with the Kansas Licensed Beverage Association to implement the change.

The Senate Transportation Committee added the amendments pertaining to the fees charged for the commercial drivers' licenses issued to persons 21 years of age or older; the farm permit issued to persons less than 21 years of age; and the renewal license issued to persons less than 21 years of age.

No fiscal note was available when the Committee took action on the bill.
