SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON SENATE BILL NO. 580

As Recommended by Senate Committee on Federal and State Affairs

Brief*

SB 580 would repeal existing statutes that were adopted last year, dealing specifically with the consolidation of the City of Topeka and Shawnee County. The bill would repeal statutes that are no longer in force or applicable because the consolidation plan failed.

Background

In 2005, the Kansas Legislature approved HB 2083 which created a consolidation commission charged with drafting a consolidation plan for the City of Topeka and Shawnee County, with the approval of the voters. A consolidation plan was proposed and was rejected by a majority of the voters. In addition to repealing statutes that are no longer in force or applicable because the consolidation plan failed, the bill would repeal a statute that may have the unintended consequence of requiring municipal elections in Topeka to be partisan elections.

The proponent of the bill is a representative of the City of Topeka. The City Attorney for the City of Topeka was available to answer questions at the Committee hearing on the bill.

There were no opponents of the bill who testified at the Committee hearing.

The fiscal note from the Division of Budget states that this bill would have no fiscal effect.
