CORRECTED SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2572

As Amended by House Committee on Higher Education

Brief*

The bill would amend six statutes to change the phrase "proprietary school" to the phrase "private and out-of-state postsecondary educational institution." The change in terminology would make these six statutes consistent with the Kansas Private and Out-of-State Postsecondary Educational Institution Act which became law in 2004. The bill also would amend the statute that created the Kansas Training Information Program to require that all members of the program's advisory committee work or reside in Kansas.

Background

In 2004, the Legislature combined regulation of proprietary schools and private degree-granting schools under the State Board of Regents. Statutes amended by this bill were not amended in 2004 to reflect new terminology.

The State Board of Regents requested introduction of the bill. A representative of the Board testified in support of the bill at the hearing before the House Committee on Higher Education.

The House Committee on Higher Education amended the bill to require that all members of the advisory committee for the Kansas Training Information Program either work or reside in the state.

The fiscal note prepared by the Division of the Budget states that the bill would have no fiscal effect.
