SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2613

As Recommended by House Committee on Education

Brief*

HB 2613 would amend current law concerning transportation of elementary and secondary students by school districts. Current law allows students who live ten or more miles from their residence school to attend a school in another school district if the receiving school is closer to the student's home. The bill would remove the requirement that the receiving school must be closer to the student's home than the school in the district of residence.

Background

Representative Clay Aurand appeared as a proponent and a representative of the Kansas Association of School Boards appeared as an opponent.

The fiscal note indicates that enactment of the bill would have no fiscal effect on the Department of Education. As students move between districts, state aid would follow the student.
