SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2707

As Amended by House Committee on Transportation

Brief*

HB 2707, as amended, would increase the period of time a person must be seizure free prior to application for a driver's license, including a license renewal, from six to 12 months.

Background

Conferees who testified in support of the bill as introduced were Representative Jo Ann Pottorff; David Schaefer, CPA; and Carol Ann Dobbins, Lawrence, Kansas. Kim Harp, Topeka, Kansas appeared as opponent. Martha Bean, Division of Vehicles, Driver Review Section, provided information about the application process and other related information.

The House Transportation Committee amendment would restore the present requirement that a doctor's report to be based on an examination occuring no more than three months prior to the date the report is submitted. The original bill would have changed this requirement to no more than 30 days prior to the date the report is submitted.

Passage of the bill would not significantly affect State Highway Fund revenues.
