SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2830

As Recommended by House Committee on Health and Human Services

Brief*

HB 2830 would amend existing pharmacy law regarding the registration of pharmacy technicians to require pharmacy technicians to pass a board approved examination within 30 days of registration with the State Board of Pharmacy. Under current law, an applicant for registration as a pharmacy technician would have to pass the examination prior to registration. The bill would amend the ratio of pharmacists to pharmacy technicians requirement to allow that on and after July 1, 2006, any change to this ratio in the prescription area of pharmacy must be adopted by a vote of no less than five members of the Board. The bill also would repeal an obsolete provision of the statute.

Background

The bill was introduced by the House Health and Human Services Committee at the request of Representative Hill.

The fiscal note prepared by the Division of the Budget indicates that passage of the bill would have no fiscal effect.
