SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2872

As Recommended by House Committee on Wildlife, Parks and Tourism

Brief*

HB 2872 would designate the grass known as Little Bluestem as the official grass of the state of Kansas.

Background

Conferees who testified in favor of the bill included Representative Yoder; Jan Anderson, Science Teacher at Shawnee Mission South High; Jeremy Roberts, student; Jerrod Reddick, student; and Stephanie Waxman, student. Conferees stated the important characteristics of the little bluestem. They noted, among other things, that:

- It is found throughout the State of Kansas;
- Due to its hardiness the grass is becoming a preferred grass among homeowners;
- The grass will tolerate high soil salinity or alkaline conditions;
- It is dought resistent;
- It is one of the most commonly observed native grasses found along roadsides; and
- Its seeds are consumed by small mammals and waterfowl.

No conferees testified against the bill.

No fiscal note was available when the House Committee took action on the bill.
