SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON SENATE BILL NO. 123

As Recommended by Senate Committee on
Transportation

Brief*

SB 123 would amend state law to allow the owner of a registered antique vehicle to display a model year license plate originally issued by a Kansas city or a reproduction of such city-issued license plate. The bill would allow such a plate to be displayed in lieu of a state-issued license plate on the rear of the vehicle or on the front of the vehicle.

Background

Representative Bob Bethell presented testimony on behalf of Ken Hand, Wichita. No other testimony was presented on the bill.

The State of Kansas first registered vehicles in 1913. Current state law defines an "antique vehicle" as any vehicle more than 35 years old (KSA 2008 Supp. 8-166).

According to the fiscal note from the Division of the Budget, the Department of Revenue estimated costs of \$720 to modify the Vehicle Information Processing System.
