**SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2456**

As Amended by House Committee on  
Judiciary

**Brief\***

HB 2456 would make changes to probate law regarding when a decedent's will and affidavit may be filed. The bill would clarify that it is the "known" real and personal property in the probate estate that is of concern.

Under provisions of the bill, a will and affidavit can be filed if the decedent's probate estate contains no known real or personal property, or the value of the known real and personal property in the decedent's probate estate is less than the total of all known demands against the estate.

**Background**

A representative of the Judicial Council spoke in favor of the bill.

There was no testimony in opposition to the bill.

The House Committee made clarifying amendments to the bill.

The fiscal note indicates no fiscal effect.
