## **Talking Points**

### Overview/Background of Program

- Child Placing Agency Program began in 2014
  - Currently 100 foster homes and 160 kids placed
- o TFFH Grant began March 2024
  - 1 year grant with 3 renewals possible
  - 2 Staff hired- Therapeutic FH Specialist, FH Recruiter/trainer
  - 6 families identified and enrolled in training beginning Sept.9
  - Foster Families to begin accepting placements mid-November

# • Return On Investment-Impact of Program

#### Performance Measures

- Consistent increase in the number of TFFH's in Kansas by 5-8 measured by growing numbers of approved TFFH over the length of the award.
- 80% of youth placed in a grantee TFFH directly from a congregate care setting will maintain placement or experience one transition to a lower level of care for a period of 6 months from date of placement.
- 70% of children placed in a grantee TFFH will step down into this placement setting from congregate care.

#### Model Highlights

- Intensive support to families
  - Weekly in home visits
  - Daily check in
  - FFT Program Referrals
  - Extensive training- weekly support/training groups (2 hours each),
    Pressley Ridge training- 11 weeks long, Behavior Crisis Management
- Families commit to accepting the highest acuity level children- maximum of 2 youth per therapeutic foster home. Projecting to serve 5-10 youth the first vear.
- Mentoring Program for foster families
