Dear Honorable Chairman Thompson and Members of the Senate Committee on Federal and State Affairs,

I strongly urge your support of Senate Bill 366: Prohibiting the mailing of advance voting ballot applications to voters unless by a county election official pursuant to a request by the voter.

I have personally been the recipient of several advanced voting ballot applications for recent past elections despite my intending to vote in person. I had not requested these applications.

Besides being a waste of taxpayer dollars, it is an invitation to voter fraud, as the application for Advance Voting Ballot by Mail, with my personal details filled in, is prominently displayed.

As the following article shows, mail-in ballots are one of several ways voter fraud is encouraged. A recent poll in December 2023 showed that "One-in-Five Mail-In Voters Admit to Committing at Least One Kind of Voter Fraud During 2020 Election".
