Chairman Petersen and members of the Senate Committee on Transportation, Safe Kids Kansas is pleased to provide testimony in support of SB 142. Safe Kids Kansas is a nonprofit coalition of partnering agencies, organizations and businesses, whose mission is to prevent unintentional injuries and injury-related death to Kansas children.

Summary of Issue and Position:

As injury prevention specialists and safety professionals, we advocate for safety on our Kansas roadways. While most often that is promoting seat belt and car seat use while the vehicle is in motion, there remains additional hazards such as when that vehicle is stopped or disabled along our highways. SB 142 proposes to enhance the current state "Move Over" law that requires motorists to move over one lane to provide a safe distance when they encounter an emergency, road maintenance or utility vehicle along the road. This proposed enhancement would include all vehicles displaying hazard warning signals, road flares or caution signals, including traffic cones, caution signs or reflective triangles. This enhancement would afford the same extra level of safety protection for all people along the roadside, including families. *Please note KDOT crash data from 2018-2022 below.

Currently 21 states, including Colorado, Oklahoma and Iowa have this law in practice. Other neighboring states including Nebraska and Missouri are considering it.

Safe Kids Kansas supports SB 142 and reasonable penalties for drivers who either fail to move over when able and/or do not practice due caution, to help keep all individuals safe on our Kansas highways.

Thank you for the opportunity to provide this testimony. We believe all children deserve the chance to grow up free from preventable injuries.

*Kansas crash statistics show that from 2018-2022:

- 688 empty vehicles were struck while on the side of road. These crashes resulted in 11 fatalities, 19 suspected serious injuries, 198 possible or minor injuries and 513 property damage only crashes.
- Additionally, 64 crashes occurred with someone in a vehicle while on the side of road during this same time period. These crashes resulted in 2 fatalities, 1 suspected serious injury, 49 possible or minor injuries and 31 property damage only crashes.
