

Kansas Open Records Act Exceptions Continued; House Sub. for SB 349

House Sub. for SB 349 continues in existence the following exceptions to the Kansas Open Records Act:

- KSA 2-3906 and KSA 2-3907, concerning fingerprinting and criminal history record checks under the Industrial Hemp Act;
- KSA 41-511, concerning carriers of alcoholic liquors under the Kansas Liquor Control Act; and
- 50-6,109a, concerning information in the Scrap Metal Theft Reduction Act database.

The bill also amends the exception found in KSA 74-50,227, concerning information contained in a Secretary of Commerce report to House Committee on Commerce, Labor and Economic Development and Senate Committee on Commerce that would be detrimental to the development of a STAR bond project or economic development incentive program. The bill makes such reports open for inspection two years after their submission to the Legislature.
