The mission of the Kansas Board of Cosmetology (Board) is to protect the health and safety of the consuming public by licensing qualified individuals and enforcing standards of practice and sanitation. The Board of Cosmetology (Board) licenses over 31,000 individual practitioners, instructor/trainers, apprentices, and holders of temporary permits in cosmetology, electrology, esthetics, nail technology, and body arts. The Board licenses approximately 5,000 facilities and schools in those same professions, including tanning.

HB 2338 is simply changing terminology in K.S.A. 2024 Supp. 65-1958 to clarify definitions related to the permit.
