These spaces, rich with character and modern amenities, serve as hubs for innovation, drawing both locals and visitors to shop, dine, and invest in our community.

The benefits of the HTC don't stop with commercial and residential projects—it has also been instrumental in preserving and revitalizing key nonprofit spaces. The restoration of the Historic Granada Theatre, a downtown icon, simply would not have been possible without the HTC. This venue now serves as a cultural and economic engine, hosting events that bring thousands of people downtown, benefiting local businesses and fostering a sense of community pride. Additionally, the HTC has ensured that historic houses of worship and other essential nonprofit venues remain viable for future generations, safeguarding the institutions that serve as the backbone of our communities.

The Kansas Historic Tax Credit is not just a preservation tool—it is an economic driver that strengthens our tax base, maximizes existing infrastructure, and creates sustainable growth. Downtown Emporia's success story is proof that this program works. Continued legislative support for the HTC is critical to
