Chair Thompson and Members of the Committee, thank you so much for giving me time to share my thoughts on SB 254 with you today. My name is Randy Lopez and I am a voter in Wyandotte County. I also serve as an elected member of the Board of Education for USD 500, Kansas City Kansas Public Schools. Additionally, current state policy only gives them a chance to pay full price by offering in-state tuition for undocumented students (including DACA recipients); these students do not receive public (federal or state) grants and scholarships–or even subsidized student loans. Benefits

such as SNAP and Medicaid require a social security number to even apply; something that undocumented individuals DO NOT have. The notion that undocumented students receive extensive public resources is false and not based in existing law/statutes.

As someone who sees a student population and community that works hard to provide opportunities for growth and excellence, I am asking that you vote no on SB254.
