Chairman Warren and Members of the Committee, thank you for reading my testimony today. My name is Jonathan smith, and I am a voter in Topeka / Shawnee County. I am writing to encourage you and your colleagues to vote NO on HB 2062

I wish I could write to you today to tell you how much I appreciate that you are supporting women, or families, or children, but I cannot. I'm embarrassed.
