SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2176 by Representative Poetter Parshall


In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2176 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2176 would require all private schools to be subject to a student attendance multiplier factor for determining a school's classification of activities regulated by the Kansas State High School Activities Association. The multiplier factor would be used to determine a school's classification for all activities, except for changing a school's classification from six-person football to eight-person football, or from eight-person football to 11-person football. A classification change because of a multiplier could not be appealed.

A private school that has won five or more state championships during the immediately preceding five school years would be subject to a championship multiplier factor. The bill would outline the calculation of the multiplier factor. If a private school would be subject to a championship multiplier, then the private school would also be subject to a geographic population multiplier factor, as outlined by the bill. If a private school would be subject to a championship multiplier factor, then the private school would also be subject to a socio-economic population multiplier factor, as outlined in the bill. The provisions of the multipliers would sunset on June 30, 2030.

The Department of Education and the Kansas Association of School Boards indicate that the enactment of HB 2176 would have no fiscal effect.
