
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2270 by House Committee on Legislative Modernization

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2270 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2270 would allow the Chief Information Technology Officer (CITO) of the branch of government being audited to receive written reports of certain information technology audits. The bill would also specify that infrastructure as a service and platform as a service cloud computing services would be performed by or contracted by the Office of Information Technology Services (OITS). Software as a service applications would be registered and inventoried with OITS. The bill would require any procurement of central processing units or distributed computing equipment with a cost of \$75,000 or more to be approved by the Executive Branch CITO. The bill would allow the CITO to authorize a division, department, or agency to procure its own telecommunications services, equipment, or software if it is compatible OITS services. The bill also requires the CITO to monitor executive agencies' compliance with certain components of the strategic information technology management plan adopted by the Information Technology Executive Counsel.

OITS indicates enactment of the bill would not have a fiscal effect on the agency.
