
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2615 by House Committee on Transportation

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2615 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2615 would designate the portion of U.S. Highway 75 from its southern junction with U.S. Highway 166 in Montgomery County then south to the Kansas-Oklahoma border as the Brig Gen George H Wark Memorial Highway. The bill would require the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) to place signs to indicate the designation.

KDOT estimates that it would cost \$5,220 to manufacture and install two signs for the highway designated in the bill (\$2,610 per sign). However, current law requires that sufficient gifts and donations be received by KDOT prior to installing the signs to reimburse the agency for the initial cost, plus an additional 50.0 percent of the initial cost to defray future sign maintenance. Altogether, \$7,830 would be needed from donations to install the signs. KDOT indicates implementation of the bill would require an increase of \$5,220 to the expenditure limitation for the agency operations account in FY 2027. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2615 is not reflected in *The FY 2027 Governor's Budget Report*.
