
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 186 by Senate Committee on Judiciary

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 186 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 186 would remove the requirement in statute that, for a warrant or summons executed prior to July 1, 2014, affidavits or sworn testimony in support of probable cause cannot be made available for examination without a written order of the court, except when requested by a defendant's counsel. The bill would require affidavits or sworn testimony in support of probable cause to be made available to law enforcement agencies prior to the execution of a warrant or summons.

The Office of Judicial Administration indicates enactment of the bill could increase expenditures for the Judicial Branch because the bill's provisions would require that affidavits or sworn testimony must be made available to law enforcement agencies prior to execution of a warrant or summons. However, a precise fiscal effect cannot be estimated. Any fiscal effect associated with SB 186 is not reflected in *The FY 2026 Governor's Budget Report*.
