SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 1 by Senator Titus

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 1 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

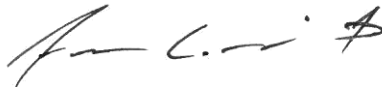
SB 1 would exempt Kansas from observing federal daylight saving time provisions beginning the first Sunday of November 2025 at 2:00 a.m. The bill would not affect any actions, rights, or movements governed by federal law. The bill also would require the Secretary of State to monitor and publish a notification of the enactment of any federal law that establishes year-round observation of central daylight saving time. As a result of enactment of the federal law for which the Secretary of State provides notice, the provision of SB 1 exempting Kansas from observing daylight saving time would have no force and effect.

SB 1 would also establish central daylight saving time as the permanent standard time for the state of Kansas beginning on the first Sunday of November after the effective date of the bill. The bill would be effective after its publication in the statute book and after the date of publication of the notice by the Secretary of State of the enactment of any federal law that establishes year-round observation of central daylight saving time.

The Secretary of State indicates under SB 1, the agency would publish a notice in the *Kansas Register* if any federal law were passed. Publication of the notice would cost approximately \$200 from its fee funds, which is based on the number of words included in the notice. The agency would cover the cost within its existing resources. The Office of Information Technology Services and the Kansas Highway Patrol indicate SB 1 would not have a fiscal effect

on operations. Any fiscal effect associated with SB 1 is not reflected in *The FY 2026 Governor's Budget Report*.
