
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 416 by Senator Shane

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 416 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 416 would authorize interior inspections of residential property without the consent of the occupant: (1) if the inspection is conducted pursuant to an administrative warrant; or (2) there is probable cause of imminent danger related to health and safety on the property and notice is provided that is reasonable under the circumstances.

The Office of Judicial Administration states any fiscal effect resulting from the enactment of the bill could be absorbed within existing resources. The Kansas Association of Counties states enactment of the bill would have a fiscal effect on Kansas counties. According to the Association, there could be savings because counties would no longer have to go to court to obtain a warrant to check for any imminent danger related to health and safety; however, the Association did not estimate a fiscal effect. The League of Kansas Municipalities states the bill's enactment would not have a fiscal effect on Kansas cities.
