AN ACT concerning driver's licenses of noncitizens; requiring the director
 of the division of motor vehicles to make monthly reports of names and
 addresses of noncitizens to the secretary of state; amending K.S.A. 8 240 and repealing the existing section.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

7 New Section 1. The director of the division of motor vehicles shall 8 provide a list of all permanent and temporary drivers' licenses issued to 9 noncitizens quarterly and forward this list to the secretary of state. The list 10 shall contain the names, addresses, phone numbers, social security numbers, dates of birth, temporary drivers' license numbers and expiration 11 12 dates of such licenses. The secretary of state shall compare such lists with 13 the voter registration rolls and delete any names of noncitizens that appear 14 on the voter rolls. The secretary of state shall notify any person removed 15 from the voter registration rolls that the person may be reinstated on the 16 voter registration rolls by providing proof of their citizenship.

17 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 8-240 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-240. (a) 18 (1) Every application for an instruction permit shall be made upon a form 19 furnished by the division of vehicles and accompanied by a fee of \$2 for 20 class A, B, C or M and \$5 for all commercial classes. Every other 21 application shall be made upon a form furnished by the division and 22 accompanied by an examination fee of \$3, unless a different fee is required 23 by K.S.A. 8-241, and amendments thereto, and by the proper fee for the 24 license for which the application is made. All commercial class applicants 25 shall be charged a \$15 driving test fee for the drive test portion of the 26 commercial driver's license application. If the applicant is not required to 27 take an examination or the commercial license drive test, the examination 28 or commercial drive test fee shall not be required. The examination shall 29 consist of three tests, as follows: (A) Vision; (B) written; and (C) driving. 30 For a commercial driver's license, the drive test shall consist of three 31 components, as follows: (A) Pre-trip; (B) skills test; and (C) road test. If 32 the applicant fails the vision test, the applicant may have correction of 33 vision made and take the vision test again without any additional fee. If an 34 applicant fails the written test, the applicant may take such test again upon 35 the payment of an additional examination fee of \$1.50. If an applicant fails

1 the driving test, the applicant may take such test again upon the payment 2 of an additional examination fee of \$1.50. If an applicant for a commercial 3 driver's license fails any portion of the commercial drive test, the applicant 4 may take such test again upon the payment of an additional drive test fee 5 of \$10. If an applicant fails to pass all three of the tests within a period of 6 six months from the date of original application and desires to take 7 additional tests, the applicant shall file an application for reexamination 8 upon a form furnished by the division, which shall be accompanied by a 9 reexamination fee of \$3, except that any applicant who fails to pass the 10 written or driving portion of an examination four times within a six-month period, shall be required to wait a period of six months from the date of the 11 12 last failed examination before additional examinations may be given. 13 Upon the filing of such application and the payment of such reexamination fee, the applicant shall be entitled to reexamination in like manner and 14 subject to the additional fees and time limitation as provided for 15 16 examination on an original application. If the applicant passes the 17 reexamination, the applicant shall be issued the classified driver's license 18 for which the applicant originally applied, which license shall be issued to expire as if the applicant had passed the original examination. 19

20 (2) Applicants for class M licenses who have completed prior 21 motorcycle safety training in accordance with department of defense 22 instruction 6055.04 (DoDI 6055.04) or the motorcycle safety foundation 23 are not required to complete further written and driving testing pursuant to 24 paragraph (1). An applicant seeking exemption from the written and 25 driving tests pursuant to this paragraph shall provide a copy of the 26 motorcycle safety foundation completion form to the division prior to 27 receiving a class M license.

28 (3) On and after January 1, 2017, an applicant for a class M license 29 who passes a driving examination on a three-wheeled motorcycle that is 30 not an autocycle shall have a restriction placed on such applicant's license 31 limiting the applicant to the operation of a registered three-wheeled motorcvcle. An applicant for a class M license who passes a driving 32 33 examination on a two-wheeled motorcycle may operate any registered 34 two-wheeled or three-wheeled motorcycle. The driving examination 35 required by this paragraph shall be administered by the division, by the 36 department of defense or as part of a curriculum recognized by the 37 motorcycle safety foundation.

(b) (1) For the purposes of obtaining any driver's license or instruction permit, an applicant shall submit, with the application, proof of age and proof of identity as the division may require. The applicant also shall provide a photo identity document, except that a non-photo identity document is acceptable if it includes both the applicant's full legal name and date of birth, and documentation showing the applicant's name, the applicant's address of principal residence and the applicant's social security
 number. The applicant's social security number shall remain confidential
 and shall not be disclosed, except as provided pursuant to K.S.A. 74-2012,
 and amendments thereto. If the applicant does not have a social security
 number, the applicant shall provide proof of lawful presence and Kansas
 residency. The division shall assign a distinguishing number to the license
 or permit.

8 (2) The division shall not issue any driver's license or instruction 9 permit to any person who fails to provide proof that the person is lawfully 10 present in the United States. Before issuing a driver's license or instruction 11 permit to a person, the division shall require valid documentary evidence 12 that the applicant: (A) Is a citizen or national of the United States; (B) is an 13 alien lawfully admitted for permanent or temporary residence in the United States; (C) has conditional permanent resident status in the United 14 15 States; (D) has an approved application for asylum in the United States or 16 has entered into the United States in refugee status; (E) has a valid, 17 unexpired nonimmigrant visa or nonimmigrant visa status for entry into 18 the United States; (F) has a pending application for asylum in the United 19 States: (G) has a pending or approved application for temporary protected 20 status in the United States; (H) has approved deferred action status; or (I) 21 has a pending application for adjustment of status to that of an alien 22 lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United States or 23 conditional permanent resident status in the United States.

24 (3) If an applicant provides evidence of lawful presence set out in 25 subsections (b)(2)(E) through (2)(I), or is an alien lawfully admitted for temporary residence under subsection (b)(2)(B), the division may only 26 27 issue a driver's license to the person under the following conditions: (A) A 28 driver's license issued pursuant to this subparagraph shall be valid only during the period of time of the applicant's authorized stay in the United 29 30 States or, if there is no definite end to the period of authorized stay, a 31 period of one year; (B) a driver's license issued pursuant to this 32 subparagraph shall clearly indicate that it is temporary and shall state the 33 date on which it expires; (C) no driver's license issued pursuant to this 34 subparagraph shall be for a longer period of time than the time period permitted by K.S.A. 8-247(a), and amendments thereto; and (D) a driver's 35 36 license issued pursuant to this subparagraph may be renewed, subject at 37 the time of renewal, to the same requirements and conditions as set out in 38 this subsection (b) for the issuance of the original driver's license.

(4) The division shall not issue any driver's license or instruction
permit to any person who is not a resident of the state of Kansas, except as
provided in K.S.A. 8-2,148, and amendments thereto.

42 (5) The division shall not issue a driver's license to a person holding a 43 driver's license issued by another state without making reasonable efforts to confirm that the person is terminating or has terminated the driver's
 license in the other state.

3 (6) The parent or guardian of an applicant under 16 years of age shall 4 sign the application for any driver's license submitted by such applicant.

5 (c) Every application shall state the full legal name, date of birth, 6 gender and address of principal residence of the applicant, and briefly 7 describe the applicant, and shall state whether the applicant has been 8 licensed as a driver prior to such application, and, if so, when and by what 9 state or country. Such application shall state whether any such license has ever been suspended or revoked, or whether an application has ever been 10 refused, and, if so, the date of and reason for such suspension, revocation 11 12 or refusal. In addition, applications for commercial drivers' licenses and instruction permits for commercial licenses-must shall include the 13 following: The applicant's social security number;, the person's signature; 14 and the person's: (1) Digital color image or photograph; or (2) a laser 15 16 engraved photograph;, certifications, including those required by 49 C.F.R. § 383.71(a), effective January 1, 1991;, a consent to release driving record 17 information; and, any other information required by the division. Each 18 19 application for a driver's license shall include a question asking if the 20 applicant is willing to give such applicant's authorization to be listed as an 21 organ, eye or tissue donor in the Kansas donor registry in accordance with 22 the revised uniform anatomical gift act, K.S.A. 65-3220 through 65-3244, 23 and amendments thereto. The gift would become effective upon the death 24 of the donor.

(d) When an application is received from a person previously licensed in another jurisdiction, the division shall request a copy of the driver's record from the other jurisdiction. When received, the driver's record shall become a part of the driver's record in this state with the same force and effect as though entered on the driver's record in this state in the original instance.

(e) When the division receives a request for a driver's record fromanother licensing jurisdiction the record shall be forwarded without charge.

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(f) A fee shall be charged as follows:

- 34 (1) For a class C driver's license issued to a person at least 21 years of
 35 age, but less than 65 years of age, \$18;
- 36 (2) for a class C driver's license issued to a person 65 years of age or
 37 older, \$12;

38 (3) for a class M driver's license issued to a person at least 21 years of
39 age, but less than 65 years of age, \$12.50;

40 (4) for a class M driver's license issued to a person 65 years of age or 41 older, \$9;

42 (5) for a class A or B driver's license issued to a person who is at least
43 21 years of age, but less than 65 years of age, \$24;

1 (6) for a class A or B driver's license issued to a person 65 years of 2 age or older, \$16;

3 (7) for any class of commercial driver's license issued to a person 21
4 years of age or older, \$18; or

5 6 (8) for class A, B, C or M, or a farm permit, or any commercial driver's license issued to a person less than 21 years of age, \$20.

7 A fee of \$10 shall be charged for each commercial driver's license 8 endorsement, except air brake endorsements, which shall have no charge.

9 A fee of \$3 per year shall be charged for any renewal of a license issued 10 prior to the effective date of this act to a person less than 21 years of age.

If one fails to make an original application or renewal application for a driver's license within the time required by law, or fails to make application within 60 days after becoming a resident of Kansas, a penalty of \$1 shall be added to the fee charged for the driver's license.

(g) Any person who possesses an identification card as provided in
K.S.A. 8-1324, and amendments thereto, shall surrender such
identification card to the division upon being issued a valid Kansas driver's
license or upon reinstatement and return of a valid Kansas driver's license.

(h) The division shall require that any person applying for a driver's
license submit to a mandatory facial image capture. The captured facial
image shall be displayed on the front of the applicant's driver's license.

(i) The director of vehicles may issue a temporary driver's license to
 an applicant who cannot provide valid documentary evidence as defined
 by subsection (b)(2), if the applicant provides compelling evidence
 proving current lawful presence. Any temporary license issued pursuant to
 this subsection shall be valid for one year.

27 (i) (1) For purposes of this subsection, the division may rely on the 28 division's most recent, existing color digital image and signature image of the applicant for the class C or M driver's license or any class of 29 30 commercial driver's license if the division has the information on file. The 31 determination on whether an electronic online renewal application or 32 equivalent of a driver's license is permitted shall be made by the director of 33 vehicles or the director's designee. The division shall not renew a driver's 34 license through an electronic online or equivalent process if the license has 35 been previously renewed through an electronic online application in the 36 immediately preceding driver's license period. No renewal under this 37 subsection shall be granted to any person who is:

38 39 (A) Younger than 30 days from turning 21 years of age;(B) 65 years of age or older;

40 (C) a registered offender pursuant to K.S.A. 22-4901 et seq., and 41 amendments thereto;

42 (D) a person issued a temporary driver's license issued pursuant to 43 K.S.A. 8-240(b)(3), and amendments thereto, provided the license is not 1 otherwise withdrawn; or

2 (E) a person issued a commercial driver's license that has a hazardous3 materials endorsement.

4 (2) The vision examination requirements in K.S.A. 8-247(e), and 5 amendments thereto, are not required for electronic online renewal 6 applications, except that the electronic online renewal applicant must 7 certify under penalty of law that the applicant's vision satisfies the 8 requirements of K.S.A. 8-295, and amendments thereto, and has 9 undergone an examination of eyesight by a licensed ophthalmologist or a 10 licensed optometrist within the last year. As a condition for any electronic online renewal application, the applicant must: (A) Authorize the exchange 11 12 of vision and medical information between the division and the applicant's 13 ophthalmologist or optometrist; and (B) is at least 21 years of age; but less 14 than 65 years of age. The ophthalmologist or optometrist shall have four 15 business days to confirm or deny the vision and medical information of the 16 applicant. If no response is received by the division, the division shall 17 accept the vision and medical information provided for processing the 18 renewal application. The waiver of vision examination for online renewal 19 applications contained within this subsection shall expire on July 1, 2022.

20 (3) The secretary of revenue shall adopt and administer rules and 21 regulations to implement a program to permit an electronic online renewal 22 of a driver's license, including, but not limited to, requirements that an 23 electronic online renewal applicant shall have previously provided 24 documentation of identity, lawful presence and residence to the division 25 for electronic scanning.

(4) Prior to February 1, 2022, the division shall report to the house
and *the* senate committees on transportation regarding the online renewal
process of this subsection and its effects to safety on the state's roads and
highways.

(5) Any person seeking to renew a commercial driver's license
pursuant to this subsection shall be required to provide the division with a
valid medical examiner's certificate and proof of completion of the
truckers against trafficking training.

(k) The director of the division of motor vehicles shall submit a
quarterly report to the secretary of state for all persons for whom a
driver's license has been issued as required by section 1, and amendments
thereto.
