1 AN ACT concerning the Kansas law enforcement training act; authorizing
2 persons who are 20 years of age or older to apply for certification as a
3 police officer or law enforcement officer; amending K.S.A. 2024 Supp.
4 74-5605 and repealing the existing section.

6 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

7 Section 1. K.S.A. 2024 Supp. 74-5605 is hereby amended to read as
8 follows: 74-5605. (a) Every applicant for certification shall be:

9 (1) An employee of a state, county or city law enforcement agency, a
10 municipal university police officer, a railroad policeman appointed
11 pursuant to K.S.A. 66-524, and amendments thereto;

12 (2) an employee of the tribal law enforcement agency of an Indian
13 nation that has entered into a tribal-state gaming compact with this state;

14 (3) a manager or employee of the horsethief reservoir benefit district
15 pursuant to K.S.A. 82a-2212, and amendments thereto; or

16 (4) a school security officer designated as a school law enforcement
17 officer pursuant to K.S.A. 72-6146, and amendments thereto.

18 (b) Prior to admission to a course conducted at the training center or
19 at a certified state or local law enforcement agency, the applicant's
20 appointing authority or agency head shall furnish to the director of police
21 training and to the commission a statement certifying that the applicant has
22 been found to meet the minimum requirements of certification established
23 by this subsection. The commission may rely upon the statement of the
24 appointing authority or agency head as evidence that the applicant meets
25 the minimum requirements for certification to issue a provisional
26 certification. Each applicant for certification shall meet the following
27 minimum requirements:

28 (1) Be a United States citizen;

29 (2) have been fingerprinted pursuant to K.S.A. 2024 Supp. 22-4713,
30 and amendments thereto, and a search of local, state and national
31 fingerprint files made to determine whether the applicant has a criminal
32 record;

33 (3) not have been convicted of a crime that would constitute a felony
34 under the laws of this state, a misdemeanor crime of domestic violence or
35 a misdemeanor offense that the commission determines reflects on the

1 honesty, trustworthiness, integrity or competence of the applicant as
 2 defined by rules and regulations of the commission;

3 (4) have:

4 (A) graduated from a high school accredited by the Kansas state
 5 board of education or the appropriate accrediting agency of another state
 6 jurisdiction;

7 (B) obtained a high school education from a nonaccredited private
 8 secondary school as defined in K.S.A. 72-4345, and amendments thereto;
 9 or

10 (C) obtained the equivalent of a high school education as defined by
 11 rules and regulations of the commission;

12 (5) be of good moral character sufficient to warrant the public trust in
 13 the applicant as a police officer or law enforcement officer;

14 (6) have completed an assessment, including psychological testing
 15 approved by the commission, to determine that the applicant does not have
 16 a mental or personality disorder that would adversely affect the ability to
 17 perform the essential functions of a police officer or law enforcement
 18 officer with reasonable skill, safety and judgment;

19 (7) be free of any physical or mental condition which adversely
 20 affects the ability to perform the essential functions of a police officer or
 21 law enforcement officer with reasonable skill, safety and judgment; ~~and~~

22 (8) *be at least 20 years of age; and*

23 (9) *be at least 21 years of age prior to service as a full-time or part-*
 24 *time police officer or law enforcement officer.*

25 (c) The commission may deny a provisional or other certification
 26 upon a finding that the applicant has engaged in conduct for which a
 27 certificate may be revoked, suspended or otherwise disciplined as provided
 28 in K.S.A. 74-5616, and amendments thereto. When it appears that grounds
 29 for denial of a certification exist under this subsection, after a conditional
 30 offer of employment has been made to an applicant seeking appointment
 31 as a police officer or law enforcement officer, the applicant's appointing
 32 authority or agency head may request an order from the commission to
 33 determine whether a provisional certification will be issued to that
 34 applicant.

35 (d) As used in this section, "conviction" includes rendering of
 36 judgment by a military court martial pursuant to the uniform code of
 37 military justice, by a court of the United States or by a court of competent
 38 jurisdiction in any state, whether or not expunged; and any diversion or
 39 deferred judgment agreement entered into for a misdemeanor crime of
 40 domestic violence or a misdemeanor offense that the commission
 41 determines reflects on the honesty, trustworthiness, integrity or
 42 competence of the applicant as defined by rules and regulations by the
 43 commission and any diversion agreement or deferred judgment entered

1 into on or after July 1, 1995, for a felony.

2 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2024 Supp. 74-5605 is hereby repealed.

3 Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its

4 publication in the statute book.
