House Concurrent Resolution No. 5001

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION making application to the Congress

2 of the United States for a limited national convention for the exclusive purpose of proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United 3 4 States establishing term limits for members of Congress. 5 6 WHEREAS, The framers of the Constitution of the United States of 7 America intended that the U.S. House of Representatives and the U.S. 8 Senate of the United States of America should be "dependent on the 9 people alone" (James Madison, Federalist 52); and 10 WHEREAS, Throughout American history, this dependency has evolved from a dependency on the American people alone to a 11 dependency on powerful special interests, through spending by third-12 party groups, campaigns or out-of-state donors, which have created a 13 fundamental imbalance in our representative democracy and eroded the 14 15 people's trust in government; and 16 WHEREAS, Americans across the political spectrum agree that elections in the United States of America should be free from the 17 disproportional influence of special interests and fair enough that any 18 19 citizen can be elected into office: and 20 WHEREAS, The Constitution of the State of Kansas states that "all 21 political power is inherent in the people, and all free governments are 22 founded on their authority, and are instituted for their equal protection 23 and benefit" (Bill of Rights, Section 2); and 24 WHEREAS, Article V of the Constitution of the United States 25 requires the Congress of the United States to call a convention for proposing amendments to the Constitution of the United States upon the 26 27 application of two-thirds of the legislatures of the several states; and WHEREAS, The Kansas Legislature perceives the need for a 28 convention in order to ensure balance and integrity in our elections by 29 proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States that will 30 establish term limits for members of Congress to prevent the 31 32 accumulation of inordinate power in members with longevity who are able to amass high amounts of funds for reelection; and 33 WHEREAS, A national convention would give the American people 34 35 an opportunity to come together as a nation, by discussing solutions on 36 how to ensure the integrity of our elections and renew the American 1 people's trust in government; and

WHEREAS, Article V of the Constitution of the United States clearly states that any amendment, whether proposed by the Congress of the United States or by a convention, must be ratified by 75% of the states, presently 38 states, ensuring that only the most reasonable proposals with widespread support shall become part of the Constitution of the United States; and

8 WHEREAS, Notwithstanding any federal or Kansas law to the contrary, the State of Kansas desires its delegates to such a national 9 convention to be composed equally of individuals currently elected to 10 state and local offices or to be selected by election in each congressional 11 12 district in Kansas, except that all individuals elected or appointed to 13 federal office, now or in the past, shall be prohibited from serving as 14 Kansas delegates. The State of Kansas intends to retain the ability to 15 enforce the responsibility and conduct of its delegation within the limits 16 herein expressed: Now, therefore,

17 Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Kansas, two-thirds of 18 the members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the House of Representatives and two-thirds of the members elected (or appointed) 19 20 and qualified to the Senate concurring therein: That the people of the 21 State of Kansas, speaking through its legislature and pursuant to Article V 22 of the Constitution of the United States, hereby apply to the Congress of 23 the United States to call a convention for the exclusive purpose of 24 proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to set a 25 limit on the number of terms that a person may be elected as a member of 26 the U.S. House of Representatives and the U.S. Senate; and

27 Be it further resolved: That the Secretary of State shall send enrolled 28 copies of this resolution to the President of the United States, the Vice 29 President of the United States in the Vice President's capacity as presiding officer of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States 30 31 House of Representatives, the Minority Leader of the United States 32 House of Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the United States 33 Senate, each Senator and Representative from Kansas in the Congress of 34 the United States, with the respectful request that the full and complete 35 text of this resolution be printed in the Congressional Record, the 36 presiding officers of each legislative body of each of the several states, 37 requesting the cooperation of the states in issuing an application 38 compelling the Congress of the United States to call a convention for 39 proposing amendments pursuant to Article V of the Constitution of the 40 United States.
