SENATE BILL No. 105

AN ACT concerning the offices of United States senator, state treasurer 1 2 and the commissioner of insurance; relating to the filling of vacancies 3 in such offices; requiring the appointment of a person of the same 4 political party as the incumbent; requiring the legislature to nominate 5 three persons for consideration for such appointment and that the 6 governor appoint one of the nominated persons; establishing the joint 7 committee on vacancy appointments; amending K.S.A. 25-101b and 8 40-106 and repealing the existing sections; also repealing K.S.A. 25-9 318.

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11 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

12 New Section 1. (a) Upon a vacancy occurring in the office of United States senator from this state, the governor shall make a temporary 13 14 appointment to fill such vacancy until a successor is elected and qualified. Such temporary appointment shall be made in accordance with the 15 16 provisions of sections 2 through 4, and amendments thereto. Within two 17 three calendar days after receiving a concurrent resolution adopted pursuant to section 4, and amendments thereto, or a report submitted 18 19 pursuant to section 3, and amendments thereto, the governor shall appoint 20 one of the three persons recommended as candidates in such concurrent 21 resolution or report to temporarily fill such vacancy. *Except as otherwise* 22 *provided*, at the time of the next election of representatives in congress 23 immediately following such vacancy, such vacancy shall be filled by 24 election and the senator so elected shall take office upon receiving such 25 senator's certificate of election. If the vacancy occurs on or after May 1 26 in an even-numbered year, then such vacancy shall be filled by election 27 at the election of representatives in congress held two years following 28 the year in which such vacancy occurs.

(b) No person shall be appointed pursuant to this act unless such person is a resident of this state and shall have been registered with the same political party for the immediately preceding six years as that of the United States senator elected at the immediately preceding election for such office. If the United States senator elected at the immediately preceding election for such office was not registered with any political 18

1 party, then any suitable person who is a resident of this state may be 2 appointed pursuant to sections 2 through 4, and amendments thereto.

3 (c) No person appointed pursuant to subsection (a) shall take office 4 unless such appointment is certified by the secretary of state to the 5 United States senate. The secretary shall not certify any person as being 6 appointed to fill a vacancy in the office of United States senator unless 7 such person is appointed in accordance with this section.

8 New Sec. 2. (a) Except as otherwise provided, within 10 calendar days of a vacancy occurring in the office of United States senator, the 9 office of state treasurer or the office of the commissioner of insurance, the 10 joint committee on vacancy appointments shall be established by 11 12 appointment of the members of the joint committee. Each of this state's congressional districts shall be represented by at least two members of the 13 joint committee who shall be residents thereof. The joint committee shall 14 15 consist of 12 members as follows:

16 (1) The president of the senate, or a member of the senate designated 17 by the president;

(2) one member of the senate appointed by the president;

(3) the speaker of the house of representatives, or a member of thehouse of representatives designated by the speaker;

(4) one member of the house of representatives appointed by thespeaker;

(5) two members of the senate appointed by the majority leader of thesenate;

(6) two members of the house of representatives appointed by themajority leader of the house of representatives;

(7) one member of the senate appointed by the vice president of thesenate;

(8) one member of the house of representatives appointed by thespeaker pro tem of the house of representatives;

(9) one member of the senate appointed by the minority leader of thesenate; and

(10) one member of the house of representatives appointed by theminority leader of the house of representatives.

(b) Of the members named or appointed under subsections (a)(1),
(a)(2), (a)(5) and (a)(7), each of this state's congressional districts shall
be represented by at least one such member who shall be a resident
thereof. Of the members named or appointed under subsections (a)(3),
(a)(4), (a)(6) and (a)(8), each of this state's congressional districts shall
be represented by at least one such member who shall be a resident
thereof.

42 (c) The joint committee on vacancy appointments shall not be 43 established when a vacancy occurs less than 90 calendar days prior to 1 December 31 in any year in which a general election for such office is 2 held, unless the person vacating such office was elected to such office at 3 such general election and was an incumbent in such election.

4 (e)(d) The president of the senate, or the president's designee, shall be 5 the chairperson of the joint committee and the speaker of the house of 6 representatives, or the speaker's designee, shall be the vice chairperson. 7 The vice chairperson shall exercise all the powers of the chairperson in the 8 absence of the chairperson.

9 (d)(e) The joint committee on vacancy appointments shall meet at any 10 time and at any place within the state on call of the chairperson. Members of the joint committee shall receive compensation and travel expenses and 11 12 subsistence expenses or allowances as provided in K.S.A. 75-3212, and 13 amendments thereto, when attending meetings of such committee.

14 The first meeting of the joint committee shall be held within 30 (e)(f) calendar days of a vacancy occurring in the office of United States 15 16 senator, the office of state treasurer or the office of the commissioner of 17 insurance

18 New Sec. 3. (a) The joint committee on vacancy appointments shall 19 review candidates to fill the vacancy described in section 2, and 20 amendments thereto. Such review shall include verifying that such 21 candidate satisfies federal and state requirements to hold such office and to 22 be appointed to fill a vacancy in such office. The joint committee shall 23 conduct one or more public hearings and shall grant each candidate an 24 opportunity to be heard before the joint committee.

25 (b) Except as provided in subsection (c), at the conclusion of itspublic hearings { within 30 calendar days after the first meeting of the 26 27 *joint committee*}, the joint committee shall introduce a concurrent 28 resolution in each house recommending three persons as candidates to fill 29 the vacancy. No member of the joint committee shall be recommended as 30 a candidate to fill the vacancy.

31 (c) If the joint committee concludes its public hearings while the legislature is not in regular or special session, then {, within 30 calendar 32 33 days after the first meeting of the joint committee,} the joint committee 34 shall submit a report to the governor recommending three persons as 35 candidates to fill the vacancy.

36 New Sec. 4. (a) Each house shall consider any concurrent resolution 37 that is introduced pursuant to section 3, and amendments thereto, within 10 38 days and shall either adopt such resolution or direct the joint committee to 39 reconvene to reconsider candidates to fill the vacancy.

40 (b) When directed to do so by the legislature, the joint committee shall reconvene and act in accordance with section 3, and amendments 41 thereto. When introducing any second or subsequent resolution, the joint 42 43 committee may recommend one or more of the candidates who were

1 recommended in any prior resolution.

2 Sec. 5. K.S.A. 25-101b is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-101b. (a) At the general election held in 1978 and each four-(4) years 3 4 thereafter, there shall be elected a treasurer for the state of Kansas, whose 5 term of office shall be four-(4) years beginning on the second Monday in 6 January next succeeding such treasurer's election. In case of a vacancy in 7 such office, within-two three calendar days after receiving a concurrent resolution adopted pursuant to section 4, and amendments thereto, or a 8 9 report submitted pursuant to section 3, and amendments thereto, the governor shall appoint some suitable person one of the three persons 10 recommended as candidates in such concurrent resolution or report to 11 12 serve for the unexpired term and until a successor is elected and qualified. 13 No person shall be appointed pursuant to this section unless such person 14 is a resident of this state and shall have been registered with the same 15 political party for the immediately preceding six years as that of the state 16 treasurer elected at the immediately preceding election for such office. If 17 the state treasurer elected at the immediately preceding election for such office was not registered with any political party, then any suitable person 18 19 who is a resident of this state may be appointed pursuant to sections 2 20 through 4. and amendments thereto.

(b) No person appointed pursuant to subsection (a) shall take office
unless such appointment is certified by the secretary of state. The
secretary shall not certify any person as being appointed to fill a vacancy
in the office of treasurer for the state of Kansas unless such person is
appointed in accordance with this section.

26 Sec. 6. K.S.A. 40-106 is hereby amended to read as follows: 40-106. 27 (a) At the general election held in 1978 and each four (4) years thereafter, 28 there shall be elected a commissioner of insurance for the state of Kansas, 29 whose term of office shall be four-(4) years beginning on the second Monday in January next succeeding such commissioner's election. In case 30 31 of a vacancy in such office, within two three calendar days after receiving 32 a concurrent resolution adopted pursuant to section 4, and amendments 33 thereto, or a report submitted pursuant to section 3, and amendments 34 thereto, the governor shall appoint-some suitable person one of the three 35 persons recommended as candidates in such concurrent resolution or 36 report to serve for the unexpired term and until a successor is elected and 37 qualified. No person shall be appointed pursuant to this section unless 38 such person is a resident of this state and shall have been registered with 39 the same political party for the immediately preceding six years as that of the commissioner of insurance elected at the immediately preceding 40 41 election for such office. If the commissioner of insurance elected at the 42 immediately preceding election for such office was not registered with any 43 political party, then any suitable person who is a resident of this state may

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1 be appointed pursuant to sections 2 through 4, and amendments thereto.

2 (b) No person appointed pursuant to subsection (a) shall take office 3 unless such appointment is certified by the secretary of state. The 4 secretary shall not certify any person as being appointed to fill a vacancy 5 in the office of commissioner of insurance for the state of Kansas unless 6 such person is appointed in accordance with this section.

7 New Sec. 7. The provisions of sections 1 through 4, and amendments thereto, and K.S.A. 25-101b and 40-106, as amended by 8 this act, are severable. If any portion of such provisions is declared 9 unconstitutional or invalid, or the application of any portion of such 10 provisions to any person or circumstance is held unconstitutional or 11 invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other portions of such provisions 12 that can be given effect without the invalid portion or application, and 13 the applicability of such other portions of such provisions to any person 14 15 or circumstance shall remain valid and enforceable.

16 Sec. 7. 8. K.S.A. 25-101b, 25-318 and 40-106 are hereby repealed.

publication in the Kansas register.
