1 AN ACT making and concerning appropriations for the fiscal years ending  
2 June 30, 2026, June 30, 2027, and June 30, 2028, for state agencies;  
3 authorizing certain transfers, capital improvement projects, assessments  
4 and fees; authorizing certain transfers; imposing certain restrictions and  
5 limitations; directing or authorizing certain disbursements, procedures  
6 and acts incidental to the foregoing; amending K.S.A. 2025 Supp. 2-  
7 223, 12-1775a, 12-5256, 74-50,107, 74-99b34, 76-775, 76-7,107, 79-  
8 2989, 79-3425i, 79-34,171 and 82a-955 and repealing the existing  
9 sections.

11 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

12 Section 1. (a) For the fiscal years ending June 30, 2026, June 30,  
13 2027, and June 30, 2028, appropriations are hereby made, restrictions and  
14 limitations are hereby imposed and transfers, capital improvement  
15 projects, assessments, fees, receipts, disbursements, procedures and acts  
16 incidental to the foregoing are hereby directed or authorized as provided in  
17 this act.

18 (b) The agencies named in this act are hereby authorized to initiate  
19 and complete the capital improvement projects specified and authorized by  
20 this act or for which appropriations are made by this act, subject to the  
21 restrictions and limitations imposed by this act.

22 (c) This act shall not be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 75-  
23 6702(a), and amendments thereto.

24 (d) The appropriations made by this act shall not be subject to the  
25 provisions of K.S.A. 46-155, and amendments thereto.
