## SENATE BILL No. 42

AN ACT concerning motor vehicle liability insurance; providing for the
 establishment of a web-based online insurance verification system for
 the verification of evidence of motor vehicle liability insurance;
 amending K.S.A. 8-173 and repealing the existing section.

6 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

New Section 1. (a) Sections 1 through 9{10}, and amendments
thereto, shall be known and may be cited as the Kansas real time motor
vehicle insurance verification act.

10 (b) As used in this act:

11 (1) "Act" means the Kansas real time motor vehicle *insurance* 12 *verification* act.

(2) "Commercial vehicle coverage" means any coverage provided to
 an insured, regardless of number of vehicles covered, under a commercial
 coverage form and rated from a commercial manual approved by the
 department.

17 18 (3) "Commissioner" means the commissioner of insurance.

(4) "Department" means the Kansas insurance department.

(5) "Insurance verification system" means the web-based system foronline verification of motor vehicle liability insurance.

(6) "KDOR" means the Kansas department of revenue.

New Sec. 2. (a) The commissioner shall establish a web-based system 22 23 for online verification of motor vehicle insurance and require motor 24 vehicle insurers to establish functionality for such system, as specified in 25 this act. Implementation of the insurance verification system, including 26 any exceptions as provided for in this act, supersedes any existing motor vehicle liability insurance verification system requirements and shall be 27 the sole electronic system used for the purpose of verifying motor vehicle 28 29 liability insurance as required by the laws of Kansas.

30 (b) The commissioner shall adopt such reasonable rules and31 regulations as are necessary to effectuate the provisions of this act.

32 New Sec. 3. (a) The insurance verification system shall:

1 (1) (A)(a) (1) Transmit requests to insurers for verification of motor 2 vehicle liability insurance via web services established by the insurers in 3 compliance with specifications and standards prescribed by the 4 commissioner in rules and regulations; and

5 (B)(2) insurance company systems shall respond to each request for 6 verification of motor vehicle liability insurance with a prescribed response 7 upon evaluation of the data provided in such request;

8 (2)(b) include appropriate provisions to secure its data against 9 unauthorized access in accordance with applicable data privacy protection 10 laws;

11 (3)(c) be used for verification of motor vehicle liability insurance as 12 prescribed by the laws of Kansas and shall be accessible to authorized 13 personnel of the department, KDOR division of vehicles, the courts, law 14 enforcement agencies and other entities authorized by state or federal 15 privacy laws;

16  $(\underline{4})(\mathbf{d})$  be interfaced, wherever appropriate, with existing state 17 systems; and

18 (5)(e) include information that shall enable authorized personnel to
 19 make inquiries of insurers of motor vehicle liability insurance by using
 20 multiple data elements for greater matching accuracy, including, but not{.
 21 Such information shall be} limited to:

22 (A)(1) Insurer national association of insurance commissioners
 23 company code number;

24  $(\underline{B})(2)$  vehicle identification number;

- 25  $(\bigcirc)$ (3) policy number;
- 26 (D)(4) verification date; or

 $\begin{array}{ccc} \hline (\underline{E})(5) & \text{any other information required by the commissioner or KDOR} \\ \hline (5) & \text{to operate the insurance verification system.} \end{array}$ 

New Sec. 4. The commissioner may conduct a competitive bid and
 contract with a private service provider that has successfully implemented
 similar systems in other states to assist in establishing, implementing and
 maintaining the insurance verification system.

New Sec. 5. The department shall provide funding for the implementation, ongoing maintenance and enhancement of the insurance verification system created by this act from the insurance department regulation service fund, established under K.S.A. 40-112, and amendments thereto.

New Sec. 6. (a) Insurers shall cooperate with the commissioner and
KDOR in establishing and maintaining the insurance verification system
and provide motor vehicle insurance policy status information as provided
in rules and regulations established by the commissioner.

42 (b) Insurer systems shall be permitted reasonable system downtime 43 for maintenance and other work with advance notice to KDOR. Insurers

shall not be subject to enforcement fees or other penalties under such 1 2 circumstances or when systems are unavailable because of emergency, 3 outside attack or other unexpected outages not planned by the insurer and 4 that are reasonably outside its control as determined by KDOR.

5

(c) Each property and casualty insurance company that is licensed to 6 issue motor vehicle liability insurance or is authorized to do business in 7 Kansas shall provide verification of liability insurance for every motor 8 vehicle insured in Kansas by such company as required by this act.

9 (d) This act shall not apply to vehicles insured under commercial 10 motor vehicle coverage, except that insurers of such vehicles may 11 participate on a voluntary basis.

(e) Insurers shall not be required to verify evidence of insurance for 12 vehicles registered in other jurisdictions. 13

(f) Insurers shall be immune from civil and administrative liability for 14 good faith efforts to comply with the terms of this act. 15

16 (g) Nothing in this section shall prohibit an insurer from using the 17 services of a third-party vendor to facilitate the insurance verification 18 program required by this act.

19 New Sec. 7. The commissioner may establish, through rules and 20 regulations, an alternative method for verifying motor vehicle liability 21 insurance for insurers that insure 1,000 or fewer vehicles within Kansas.

22 New Sec. 8. All information and data provided by insurance 23 companies to the insurance verification system, and all reports, responses 24 or other information generated for the purposes of the insurance 25 verification system shall be confidential by law and privileged, shall not be subject to the open records act, K.S.A. 45-215, and amendments thereto, 26 27 and shall not be subject to discovery or admissible as evidence in any 28 private civil action.

29 New Sec. 9. The insurance verification system shall be fully 30 operational not later than July 1, 2026, following an appropriate testing 31 period of not less than nine months. No enforcement action shall be taken 32 based on information obtained from the insurance verification system until 33 such system has successfully completed the testing period.

34 {New Sec. 10. Establishing compliance with the provisions of 35 K.S.A. 40-3104, and amendments thereto, through the insurance 36 verification system shall not be the primary cause for law enforcement to 37 stop a vehicle.}

38 Sec. 10{11}. K.S.A. 8-173 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-39 173. (a) An application for registration of a vehicle as provided in article 1 40 of chapter 8 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto, shall not be accepted unless the person making such application shall 41 42 exhibit<sup>.</sup>

43 (1) A receipt showing that such person has paid all personal property taxes levied against such person for the preceding year, including taxes
 upon such vehicle, except that if such application is made before May 11,
 such receipt need show payment of only-one-half <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> the preceding year's
 tax; or

5 (2) evidence that such vehicle was assessed for taxation purposes by a 6 state agency,—or was assessed as stock in trade of a merchant or 7 manufacturer or was exempt from taxation under the laws of this state.

8 (b) An application for registration of a vehicle as provided in article 1 9 of chapter 8 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto, 10 shall not be accepted if the records of the county treasurer show that the 11 applicant is delinquent and owes personal property taxes levied against the 12 applicant for any preceding year.

(c) An original application for registration of a motor vehicle shall not be accepted until the applicant signs a certification, provided by the director of motor vehicles, certifying that the applicant has and will maintain, during the period of registration, the required insurance, selfinsurance or other financial security required pursuant to K.S.A. 40-3104, and amendments thereto.

19 (d) An application for registration or renewal of registration of a 20 vehicle shall not be accepted if the applicant is unable to provide proof of 21 the insurance, self-insurance or other financial security required by article 22 31 of chapter 40 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments 23 thereto. Proof of insurance shall be verified by examination of the 24 insurance card or other documentation issued by an insurance company, a 25 certificate of self-insurance issued by the commissioner, a binder of insurance, a certificate of insurance, a motor carrier identification number 26 27 issued by the state corporation commission, proof of insurance for vehicles 28 covered under a fleet policy, a commercial policy covering more than one 29 vehicle or a policy of insurance required by K.S.A. 40-3104, and 30 amendments thereto, and for vehicles used as part of a drivers education 31 program, a dealership contract and a copy of a motor vehicle liability 32 insurance policy issued to a school district or accredited nonpublic school. 33 Examination of a photocopy, facsimile or an image displayed on a cellular 34 phone or any other type of portable electronic device of any of these 35 documents shall suffice for verification of registration or renewal. Any 36 person to whom such image of proof of insurance, self-insurance or other 37 financial security required by article 31 of chapter 40 of the Kansas 38 Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto, is displayed, shall view only 39 such image displayed on such cellular phone or other portable electronic 40 device. Such person shall be prohibited from viewing any other content or information stored on such cellular phone or other portable electronic 41 device. Proof of insurance may also be verified-on-line online or 42 43 electronically, in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas real time

insurance verification act and sections 1 through 9, and amendments 1 2 thereto, and the commissioner of insurance may require, by duly adopted 3 rules and regulations, any motor vehicle liability insurance company 4 authorized to do business in this state to provide verification of insurance 5 in that manner. Any motor vehicle liability insurance company which is 6 providing verification of insurance on-line or electronically on the day-7 preceding the effective date of this act may continue to do so in the same 8 manner and shall be deemed to be in compliance with this section.

9 (e) On and after January 1, 2018, An application for registration or renewal of registration of a vehicle shall not be accepted, if the records of 10 the division show that after three attempts by the Kansas turnpike authority 11 12 to contact the registered owner, including at least one registered letter, the registered owner of such vehicle has unpaid tolls and-that the director of 13 14 the Kansas turnpike authority or the director's designee has instructed the 15 division to refuse to accept the registration or renewal of registration, 16 pursuant to K.S.A. 68-2020a, and amendments thereto, unless the owner or 17 registered owner makes payment to the county treasurer at the time of 18 registration or renewal of registration. Of such moneys collected, 15% 19 shall be retained by the county treasurer and the remainder shall be 20 remitted to the Kansas turnpike authority.
