A PROPOSITION to amend section 1 of article 5 of the constitution of
 the state of Kansas to require individuals to be citizens of the United
 States, at least 18 years of age and a resident of the voting area in
 which such person seeks to vote in order to vote in this state.

Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Kansas, two-thirds of the members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the Senate and two-thirds of the members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the House of Representatives concurring therein:

Section 1. The following proposition to amend the constitution of the state of Kansas shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the state for their approval or rejection: Section 1 of article 5 of the constitution of the state of Kansas is hereby amended to read as follows:

14 15 "§ 1. Qualifications of electors. Every(a) No person shall be deemed a qualified elector unless such person:

16 17 (1) Is a citizen of the United States who;

(2) has attained the age of eighteen years; and who

(3) except as provided in subsection (b) or (c), resides in the
voting area in which he or she seeks to vote-shall be deemed a
qualified elector.

21 (b) Laws of this state relating to voting for presidential electors and candidates for the office of president and vice-22 23 president of the United States shall comply with the laws of the 24 United States relating thereto. A citizen of the United States, who is 25 otherwise qualified to vote in Kansas for presidential electors and candidates for the offices of president and vice-president of the 26 United States may vote for such officers either in person or by 27 absentee ballot notwithstanding the fact that such person may have 28 become a nonresident of this state if his or her removal from this 29 30 state occurs during a period in accordance with federal law next preceding such election. 31

32 (c) A person who is otherwise a qualified elector may vote in 33 the voting area of his or her former residence either in person or by absentee ballot notwithstanding the fact that such person may have
become a nonresident of such voting area during a period
prescribed by law next preceding the election at which he or she
seeks to vote, if his *or her* new residence is in another voting area
in the state of Kansas."

6 Sec. 2. The following statement shall be printed on the ballot with 7 the amendment as a whole:

"Explanatory statement. This amendment would clarify that
only a person who is a citizen of the United States, at least
18 years of age and, unless a residency exception applies to
such person, a resident of the voting area in which such
person seeks to vote is eligible to vote in this state.

"A vote for this proposition would clarify that only a person who is a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age and, unless a residency exception applies to such person, a resident of the voting area in which such person seeks to vote is eligible to vote in this state.

18 "A vote against this proposition would make no change to the
19 constitution of the state of Kansas, and the language
20 concerning voter qualifications would remain the same."

This resolution, if approved by two-thirds of the members 21 Sec. 3. elected (or appointed) and qualified to the Senate and two-thirds of the 22 members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the House of 23 Representatives, shall be entered on the journals, together with the yeas 24 and nays. The secretary of state shall cause this resolution to be published 25 as provided by law and shall cause the proposed amendment to be 26 27 submitted to the electors of the state at the general election in November in the year 2026, unless a special election is called at a sooner date by 28 concurrent resolution of the legislature, in which case the proposed 29 30 amendment shall be submitted to the electors of the state at the special 31 election
