SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2046

As Recommended by House Committee on Insurance

Brief*

HB 2046 would amend current law to allow travel insurance coverage for sickness, accident, disability, or death occurring during travel as either a separate policy or along with related coverages of emergency evacuation or repatriation of remains, to be classified and filed under either an accident and health or inland marine line of insurance.

The bill would also make technical amendments.

Background

The bill was introduced by the House Committee on Insurance at the request of a representative of the American Council of Life Insurers.

House Committee on Insurance

In the House Committee hearing, **proponent** testimony was provided by a representative of the American Council of Life Insurers, who indicated the bill would fully align statute with the National Association of Insurance Commissioners Travel Insurance Model Act, which would reduce confusion with insurers by clarifying the appropriate lines of business to file policies. The representative also indicated the bill would ensure consumers have access to travel insurance coverage

for everything from travel-related emergency evacuations to repatriation of remains.

No other testimony was provided.
