**SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2606**

As Recommended by House Committee on  
Transportation

**Brief\***

HB 2606 would amend the definition of “conviction” in the Kansas Uniform Commercial Driver’s License Act to align it with the definition in federal law establishing standards for commercial driver’s licenses.

The bill also would make technical amendments.

**Background**

The bill was introduced by the House Committee on Transportation at the request of a representative of the Kansas Department of Revenue (KDOR).

***House Committee on Transportation***

In the House Committee hearing, an attorney with KDOR and a representative of the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) provided **proponent** testimony. The KDOR attorney noted that the Kansas Court of Appeals had determined in a recent opinion that, because of the inclusion of “and” in the Kansas statutory definition, the Kansas definition was not equivalent to the federal definition, which includes non-judicial DUI resolution such as diversion. The KDOT representative stated not making this change would put the State at risk for losing a percentage of annual funding from the National Highway Performance Program and

Surface Transportation Block Grant Program and possible decertification of the state's commercial driver's license program.

No other testimony was provided.

[*Note:* In an unpublished opinion dated January 2, 2026, in *Vogt v. Kansas Department of Revenue*, the Kansas Court of Appeals found that a diversion agreement did not satisfy the definition of "conviction" in Kansas law as current law requires "both 'an unvacated adjudication of guilt, or a determination that a person has violated or failed to comply with the law' *and* {emphasis in the opinion} one of the events enumerated in the remainder of the definition." The federal definition, in 49 CFR 383.5, does not include that "and."]

### **Fiscal Information**

According to the fiscal note prepared by the Division of the Budget on the bill, KDOR and the Office of Judicial Administration indicate enactment of the bill would have no fiscal effect on the agency or the courts.
