LULAC supports the Kansas Business-Workers-Communities Partnership Act

Chairman Brunk and honorable members of the committee, my name is Elias L. Garcia and I am the State Director of the Kansas League of United Latin American Citizens (LULAC). The League of United Latin American Citizens (LULAC) is the oldest and largest Latino civil rights organization in the United States and its mission is to advance the economic condition, educational attainment, political influence, health and civil rights of Hispanic Americans through community-based programs operating at more than 1000 councils nationwide.

Mr. Chair after canvassing Hispanic and Latino leaders in communities from throughout Kansas including, Liberal, Dodge and Garden City, Wichita, Salina, Topeka, KC, I come before this honorable committee to lend our voice and **support to HB 2603, the Kansas Business-Workers-Communities Partnership Act.**

In these uncertain and unstable economic times, HB 2603 provides a common sense vehicle to addressing the most fundamental and basic need of both business and members of our local communities.
