Entity Description

KSA 74-7303 *et seq* established the three-member Crime Compensation Board appointed by the Attorney General, subject to confirmation by the Senate as provided in KSA 75-4315b.

Except as provided by KSA 46-2601, no person appointed to the Board may exercise any power, duty or function as a member of the Board until confirmed by the Senate. At no time may more than two members of the Board be from the same political party. At least one member of the Board must be a person regularly admitted to practice law in the State of Kansas.

Each member of the Board serves for a term of four years and until a successor is appointed and confirmed. Upon the expiration of any term of office of any member, the Attorney General appoints a qualified successor. In case of a vacancy on the Board prior to the expiration of a term, the Attorney General appoints a successor of similar qualifications to fill the unexpired term.

The terms of members who are serving on the Board on the effective date of the Act will expire on March 15, of the year in which such member's term would have expired under the provisions of this section prior to amendment by this Act. Thereafter, members are appointed for terms of four years and until a successor is appointed and confirmed.

The Attorney General designates a member of the Board who is regularly admitted to practice law in the State of Kansas to serve as Chairperson at the pleasure of the Attorney General. Members of the Board receive compensation, subsistence allowances, mileage and expenses as provided by KSA 75-3223.

Crime Victims Compensation Board

Powers and Duties

The Board has the power to:

- Hear and determine all matters relating to claims for compensation;
- Award compensation to persons claiming compensation for economic loss arising from criminally injurious conduct;
- Reinvestigate or reopen claims without regard to statutes of limitation or periods of prescription;
- Request investigations and data from county and district attorneys and law enforcement officers to enable
 the board to determine whether and the extent to which a claimant qualifies for compensation;
- Publicize the availability of compensation and information regarding the filing of claims; and
- Adopt rules and regulations to carry out the provisions of the law under which the Board was created and the Property Crime Restitution and Compensation Act, including rules for the allowance of attorney fees for representation of claimants, and rules and regulations providing for discovery proceedings, including medical examination.
