
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2062 by Representative Sloan

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2062 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2062 would amend current law by permitting law enforcement or parole officers to search the residence, person, and property of an offender who is on probation, parole, or postrelease supervision provided that the officer has a reasonable suspicion that a violation of probation, parole, or postrelease supervision has occurred.

Enactment of HB 2062 would have no fiscal effect. It is estimated that searches by local law enforcement agencies or the Department of Corrections would be conducted using existing resources and staff.
