
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2262 by Representative Arpke, et al.

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2262 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2262 would authorize the Secretary of Administration to convey, without consideration, the Hiram Price Dillon House to a not-for-profit corporation established to support, coordinate, foster, and develop the arts and their practice within the State of Kansas. The deed of conveyance would contain provisions requiring that the house be used as the headquarters for the not-for-profit corporation, that the members of the Legislature be allowed to use the house free of charge, and that the corporation keep the house in good repair and be responsible for all expenses related to keeping the house in good repair. If these requirements are not adhered to, the house would revert back to the state. The law would take effect upon its publication in the *Kansas Register*.

According to the State Historical Society and the Department of Administration, passage of HB 2262 would have no effect on the state budget.
