SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 358 by Senate Committee on Federal and State Affairs

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 358 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 358 would allow the holder of a manufacturer's license to serve free samples of alcoholic liquor manufactured by the licensee on the licensed premises, if the premises are located in a county where the sale of alcoholic liquor is permitted by law in licensed drinking establishments. Sample sizes would be limited to no more than a half ounce per sample and an individual would be limited to no more than four sample servings per day. Samples would be required to be served by the licensee, an employee, or an agent and would be prohibited from being served to minors. Samples would also be prohibited from being removed from the licensed premises. In addition, the licensee would be prohibited from selling any alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises.

The Department of Revenue indicates that SB 358 would have no fiscal effect on state revenues or expenditures.
