1 AN ACT concerning elections; relating to voter identification; amending
2 K.S.A. 25-2352, 25-2411, 25-2416, 25-2423 and 25-2431 and K.S.A.
3 2010 Supp. 25-1122, 25-1122d, 25-2309, 25-2908, 25-3002 and 25-
4 3104 and repealing the existing sections.

5
6 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

7 Section 1. K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 25-1122 is hereby amended to read as
8 follows: 25-1122. (a) Any registered voter may file with the county
9 election officer where such person is a resident, or where such person is
10 authorized by law to vote as a former precinct resident, an application for
11 an advance voting ballot. The signed application shall be transmitted only
12 to the county election officer by personal delivery, mail, facsimile or as
13 otherwise provided by law.

14 (b) If the registered voter is applying for an advance voting ballot to
15 be transmitted in person, and such voter is a first-time voter, such voter
16 shall provide a form of valid identification such as a current and valid
17 Kansas driver's license, nondriver's identification card, utility bill, bank
18 statement, paycheck, government check or other government document
19 containing the voter's current name and address as indicated on the
20 registration book. Such voter shall not be required to provide
21 identification if such voter has previously provided current and valid
22 identification in the county where registered. *If such voter is not a first-*
23 *time voter, then a form of valid identification shall be provided pursuant*
24 *to the requirements of K.S.A. 25-2908, and amendments thereto.*

25 (c) If the registered voter is applying for an advance voting ballot to
26 be transmitted by mail, ~~and such voter is a first-time voter,~~ such voter
27 shall provide on the application for an advance voting ballot the voter's
28 current and valid Kansas driver's license number, nondriver's
29 identification card number or the last four digits of the voter's social
30 security number, or shall provide with the application a copy of the
31 voter's current and valid Kansas driver's license, nondriver's identification
32 card, utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, government check or other
33 government document containing the voter's current name and address as
34 indicated on the registration book. ~~Such voter shall not be required to~~
35 ~~provide identification if such voter has previously provided current and~~
36 ~~valid identification in the county where registered.~~

1 (d) If a first-time voter is unable or refuses to provide current and
2 valid identification, or if the name and address do not match the voter's
3 name and address on the registration book, the voter may vote a
4 provisional ballot according to K.S.A. 25-409, and amendments thereto.
5 ~~The~~Such voter shall provide a valid form of identification as defined in
6 subsection (c) of this section to the county election officer in person or
7 provide a copy by mail or electronic means before the meeting of the
8 county board of canvassers. At the meeting of the county board of
9 canvassers the county election officer shall present copies of
10 identification received from provisional voters and the corresponding
11 provisional ballots. If the county board of canvassers determines that a
12 voter's identification is valid and the provisional ballot was properly cast,
13 the ballot shall be counted.

14 (e) *No county election officer shall provide an advance voting ballot*
15 *to a person who is requesting an advance voting ballot to be transmitted*
16 *by mail unless the county election official verifies that the signature of*
17 *the person matches that on file in the county voter registration records.*
18 *Signature verification may occur by electronic device or by human*
19 *inspection.*

20 (1) *In the event that the signature of the person who is requesting an*
21 *advance voting ballot does not match that on file, the county election*
22 *officer shall attempt to contact the person and shall offer the person*
23 *another opportunity to provide such person's signature for the purposes*
24 *of verifying the person's identity. If the county election officer is unable to*
25 *reach the person, the county election officer may transmit a provisional*
26 *ballot, however, such provisional ballot may not be counted unless a*
27 *signature is included therewith that can be verified.*

28 (2) *If a person applies for an advance voting ballot to be transmitted*
29 *by mail but fails to provide identification pursuant to this section, or the*
30 *identification of such person cannot be verified by the county election*
31 *officer, the county election officer shall provide information to such*
32 *person regarding the voter rights provisions of subsection (d) and shall*
33 *provide such person an opportunity to provide identification pursuant to*
34 *this subsection.*

35 (f)(e) Applications for advance voting ballots to be transmitted to the
36 voter by mail shall be filed only at the following times:

37 (1) For the primary election occurring on the first Tuesday in August
38 in even-numbered years, between April 1 of such year and the last
39 business day of the week preceding such primary election.

40 (2) For the general election occurring on the Tuesday succeeding the
41 first Monday in November in even-numbered years, between 90 days
42 prior to such election and the last business day of the week preceding
43 such general election.

1 (3) For the primary election held five weeks preceding the first
2 Tuesday in April, between January 1 of the year of such election and the
3 last business day of the week preceding such primary election.

4 (4) For the general election occurring on the first Tuesday in April,
5 between January 1 of the year of such election and the last business day
6 of the week preceding such general election.

7 (5) For question submitted elections occurring on the date of a
8 primary or general election, the same as is provided for ballots for
9 election of officers at such election.

10 (6) For question submitted elections not occurring on the date of a
11 primary or general election, between the time of the first published notice
12 thereof and the last business day of the week preceding such question
13 submitted election, except that if the question submitted election is held
14 on a day other than a Tuesday, the county election officer shall determine
15 the final date for mailing of advance voting ballots, but such date shall
16 not be more than three business days before such election.

17 (7) For any special election of officers, at such time as is specified
18 by the secretary of state.

19 (8) For the presidential preference primary, between January 1 of the
20 year in which such primary is held and the last business day of the week
21 preceding such primary election.

22 The county election officer of any county may receive applications
23 prior to the time specified in this subsection ~~(f)(e)~~ and hold such
24 applications until the beginning of the prescribed application period. Such
25 applications shall be treated as filed on that date.

26 ~~(f)~~(g) Unless an earlier date is designated by the county election
27 office, applications for advance voting ballots transmitted to the voter in
28 person in the office of the county election officer shall be filed on the
29 Tuesday next preceding the election and on each subsequent business day
30 until no later than ~~12:00~~ noon on the day preceding such election. If the
31 county election officer so provides, applications for advance voting
32 ballots transmitted to the voter in person in the office of the county
33 election officer also may be filed on the Saturday preceding the election.
34 Upon receipt of any such properly executed application, the county
35 election officer shall deliver to the voter such ballots and instructions as
36 are provided for in this act.

37 An application for an advance voting ballot filed by a voter who has a
38 temporary illness or disability or who is not proficient in reading the
39 English language or by a person rendering assistance to such voter may
40 be filed during the regular advance ballot application periods until the
41 close of the polls on election day.

42 The county election officer may designate places other than the central
43 county election office as satellite advance voting sites. At any satellite

1 advance voting site, a registered voter may obtain an application for
2 advance voting ballots. Such ballots and instructions shall be delivered to
3 the voter in the same manner and subject to the same limitations as
4 otherwise provided by this subsection.

5 ~~(h)~~(g) Any person having a permanent disability or an illness which
6 has been diagnosed as a permanent illness is hereby authorized to make
7 an application for permanent advance voting status. Applications for
8 permanent advance voting status shall be in the form and contain such
9 information as is required for application for advance voting ballots and
10 also shall contain information which establishes the voter's right to
11 permanent advance voting status.

12 ~~(i)~~(h) On receipt of any application filed under the provisions of this
13 section, the county election officer shall prepare and maintain in such
14 officer's office a list of the names of all persons who have filed such
15 applications, together with their correct post office address and the
16 precinct, ward, township or voting area in which such persons claim to be
17 registered voters or to be authorized by law to vote as former precinct
18 residents and the present resident address of each applicant. Such names
19 and addresses shall remain so listed until the day of such election. The
20 county election officer shall maintain a separate listing of the names and
21 addresses of persons qualifying for permanent advance voting status. All
22 such lists shall be available for inspection upon request in compliance
23 with this subsection by any registered voter during regular business
24 hours. The county election officer upon receipt of such applications shall
25 enter upon a record kept by such officer the name and address of each
26 applicant, which record shall conform to the list above required. Before
27 inspection of any advance voting ballot application list, the person
28 desiring to make such inspection shall provide to the county election
29 officer identification in the form of driver's license or other reliable
30 identification and shall sign a log book or application form maintained by
31 such officer stating such person's name and address and showing the date
32 and time of inspection. All records made by the county election officer
33 shall be subject to public inspection, except that the voter identification
34 information required by subsections (b) and (c) and the identifying
35 number on ballots and ballot envelopes and records of such numbers shall
36 not be made public.

37 ~~(j)~~(i) If a person on the permanent advance voting list fails to vote in
38 two consecutive general elections held on the Tuesday succeeding the
39 first Monday in November of each even-numbered year, the county
40 election officer may mail a notice to such voter. Such notice shall inform
41 the voter that the voter's name will be removed from the permanent
42 advance voting list unless the voter renews the application for permanent
43 advance voting status within 30 days after the notice is mailed. If the

1 voter fails to renew such application, the county election officer shall
 2 remove the voter's name from the permanent advance voting list. Failure
 3 to renew the application for permanent advance voting status shall not
 4 result in removal of the voter's name from the voter registration list.

5 (k)(+) For the purposes of this section, "first-time voter" means a
 6 registered voter who has not previously voted in any election in the
 7 county in which the voter desires to vote. First-time voter includes a
 8 person whose name was removed from the county registration list in
 9 accordance with K.S.A. 25-2316c, and amendments thereto, and who has
 10 re-registered.

11 (l)(+) The secretary of state may adopt rules and regulations defining
 12 valid forms of identification.

13 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 25-1122d is hereby amended to read as
 14 follows: 25-1122d. (a) The application for an advance voting ballot to be
 15 transmitted by mail shall be accompanied by an affirmation in substance
 16 as follows:

I understand that if I am unable or refuse to provide valid identification, I may vote a provisional ballot according to K.S.A. 25-409, and amendments thereto.

1 (c) An application for permanent advance voting status shall be on a
2 form prescribed by the secretary of state for this purpose. Such
3 application shall contain an affirmation concerning substantially the same
4 information required in subsection (a) and in addition thereto a statement
5 regarding the permanent character of such illness or disability.

6 (d) Any application by a former precinct resident shall state both the
7 former and present residence, address, precinct and county of such former
8 precinct resident and the date of change of residence.

9 (e) *The secretary of state may adopt rules and regulations in order*
10 *to implement the provisions of this section.*

11 (f) *For the purposes of this section, "first-time voter" means a*
12 *registered voter who has not previously voted in any election in the*
13 *county in which the voter desires to vote. First-time voter includes a*
14 *person whose name was removed from the county registration list in*
15 *accordance with K.S.A. 25-2316c, and amendments thereto, and has re-*
16 *registered.*

17 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 25-2411 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-
18 2411. Election perjury is intentionally and knowingly falsely swearing,
19 affirming, declaring or subscribing to any of the following: (a) Statements
20 in answer to questions put to a person who has been challenged as
21 unqualified to vote.

22 (b) Statements in answer to questions put to a witness concerning
23 the qualifications of any person to vote.

24 (c) Statements contained in any affidavit *or declaration* which is
25 prescribed by chapter 25 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, *and*
26 *amendments thereto*, or any other election law of the state, or which is
27 prescribed in any manner by the secretary of state or any county election
28 officer under the election laws of this state.

29 (d) Statements in answer to questions put by a county election
30 officer or deputy county election officer relating to application for voter
31 registration of any person.

32 (e) Statements in answer to questions put by an election board
33 member to a person asking for voter assistance because of age, visual
34 handicap, lack of proficiency in reading the English language or physical
35 disability.

36 (f) Statements of any witness at an election contest.

37 Election perjury is a severity level 89, nonperson felony.

38 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 25-2309 is hereby amended to read as
39 follows: 25-2309. (a) Any person may apply in person, by mail, through a
40 voter registration agency, or by other delivery to a county election officer
41 to be registered. Such application shall be made on: (1) A form approved
42 by the secretary of state, which shall be provided by a county election
43 officer or chief state election official upon request in person, by telephone

1 or in writing; or (2) the *national mail voter registration form issued*
2 *pursuant to application prescribed by the federal law election*
3 ~~commission~~. Such application shall be signed by the applicant under
4 penalty of perjury and shall contain the original signature of the applicant
5 or the computerized, electronic or digitized transmitted signature of the
6 applicant. A signature may be made by mark, initials, typewriter, print,
7 stamp, symbol or any other manner if by placing the signature on the
8 document the person intends the signature to be binding. A signature may
9 be made by another person at the voter's direction if the signature reflects
10 such voter's intention.

11 (b) Applications made under this section shall give voter eligibility
12 requirements and such information as is necessary to *prevent duplicative*
13 *voter registrations and enable the relevant election officer to assess the*
14 *eligibility of the applicant and to administer voter registration, identify*
15 ~~the applicant and to determine the qualifications of the applicant as an~~
16 ~~elector and the facts authorizing such person to be registered, including,~~
17 but not limited to, the following data *to be kept by the relevant election*
18 *officer as provided by law:*

19 (1) Name;

20 (2) place of residence, including specific address or location, and
21 mailing address if the residence address is not a permissible postal
22 address;

23 (3) date of birth;

24 (4) sex;

25 (5) the last four digits of the person's social security number or the
26 person's full driver's license or nondriver's identification card number;

27 (6) telephone number, if available;

28 (7) naturalization data (if applicable);

29 (8) if applicant has previously registered or voted elsewhere,
30 residence at time of last registration or voting;

31 (9) when present residence established;

32 (10) name under which applicant last registered or voted, if different
33 from present name;

34 (11) an attestation that the applicant meets each eligibility
35 requirement;

36 (12) a statement that the penalty for submission of a false voter
37 registration application is a maximum presumptive sentence of 17 months
38 in prison;

39 (13) a statement that, if an applicant declines to register to vote, the
40 fact that the applicant has declined to register will remain confidential
41 and will be used only for voter registration purposes;

42 (14) a statement that if an applicant does register to vote, the office
43 to which a voter registration application is submitted will remain

1 confidential and will be used only for voter registration purposes;

2 (15) boxes for the applicant to check to indicate whether the
3 applicant is or is not a citizen of the United States, together with the
4 question "Are you a citizen of the United States of America?";

5 (16) boxes for the county election officer or chief state election
6 official to check to indicate whether the applicant has provided with the
7 application the information necessary to assess the eligibility of the
8 applicant;

9 (17)(16) boxes for the applicant to check to indicate whether or not
10 the applicant will be 18 years of age or older on election day, together
11 with the question "Will you be 18 years of age on or before election
12 day?";

13 (18)(17) in reference to paragraphs (15) and (17)(16) the statement
14 "If you checked 'no' in response to either of these questions, do not
15 complete this form.";

16 (19)(18) a statement that the applicant may be required to provide
17 identification when voting; and

18 (20)(19) political party affiliation declaration, if any. An applicant's
19 failure to make a declaration will result in the applicant being registered
20 as an unaffiliated voter.

21 If the application discloses any previous registration in any other
22 county or state, as indicated by paragraph (8) or (10), or otherwise, the
23 county election officer shall upon the registration of the applicant, give
24 notice to the election official of the place of former registration, notifying
25 such official of applicant's present residence and registration, and
26 authorizing cancellation of such former registration. *This section shall be*
27 *interpreted and applied in accordance with federal law. No eligible*
28 *applicant whose qualifications have been assessed shall be denied*
29 *registration.*

30 (c) Any person who applies for registration through a voter
31 registration agency shall be provided with, in addition to the application
32 under subsection (b), a form which includes:

33 (1) The question "If you are not registered to vote where you live
34 now, would you like to apply to register to vote here today?";

35 (2) a statement that if the applicant declines to register to vote, this
36 decision will remain confidential and be used only for voter registration
37 purposes;

38 (3) a statement that if the applicant does register to vote, information
39 regarding the office to which the application was submitted will remain
40 confidential and be used only for voter registration purposes; and

41 (4) if the agency provides public assistance:; (i) The statement
42 "Applying to register or declining to register to vote will not affect the
43 amount of assistance that you will be provided by this agency.";

1 (ii) boxes for the applicant to check to indicate whether the applicant
2 would like to register or declines to register to vote, together with the
3 statement "IF YOU DO NOT CHECK EITHER BOX, YOU WILL BE
4 CONSIDERED TO HAVE DECIDED NOT TO REGISTER TO VOTE
5 AT THIS TIME.";

6 (iii) the statement "If you would like help in filling out the voter
7 registration application form, we will help you. The decision whether to
8 seek or accept help is yours. You may fill out the application form in
9 private."; and

10 (iv) the statement "If you believe that someone has interfered with
11 your right to register or to decline to register to vote, your right to privacy
12 in deciding whether to register or in applying to register to vote, or your
13 right to choose your own political party or other political preference, you
14 may file a complaint with the Kansas Secretary of State."

15 (d) If any person, in writing, declines to register to vote, the voter
16 registration agency shall maintain the form prescribed by subsection (c).

17 (e) A voter registration agency shall transmit the completed
18 registration application to the county election officer not later than five
19 days after the date of acceptance. Upon receipt of an application for
20 registration, the county election officer shall send, by nonforwardable
21 mail, a notice of disposition of the application to the applicant at the
22 postal delivery address shown on the application. If a notice of
23 disposition is returned as undeliverable, a confirmation mailing
24 prescribed by K.S.A. 25-2316c, and amendments thereto, shall occur.

25 (f) If an application is received while registration is closed, such
26 application shall be considered to have been received on the next
27 following day during which registration is open.

28 (g) A person who completes an application for voter registration
29 shall be considered a registered voter when the county election officer
30 adds the applicant's name to the county voter registration list.

31 (h) Any registered voter whose residence address is not a
32 permissible postal delivery address shall designate a postal address for
33 registration records. When a county election officer has reason to believe
34 that a voter's registration residence is not a permissible postal delivery
35 address, the county election officer shall attempt to determine a proper
36 mailing address for the voter.

37 (i) Any registered voter may request that such person's residence
38 address be concealed from public inspection on the voter registration list
39 and on the original voter registration application form. Such request shall
40 be made in writing to the county election officer, and shall specify a
41 clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy or a threat to the voter's
42 safety. Upon receipt of such a request, the county election officer shall
43 take appropriate steps to ensure that such person's residence address is not

1 publicly disclosed. Nothing in this subsection shall be construed as
2 requiring or authorizing the secretary of state to include on the voter
3 registration application form a space or other provision on the form that
4 would allow the applicant to request that such applicant's residence
5 address be concealed from public inspection.

6 (j) No application for voter registration shall be made available for
7 public inspection or copying unless the information required by
8 paragraph (5) of subsection (b) has been removed or otherwise rendered
9 unreadable.

10 (k) If an applicant fails to answer the question prescribed in
11 paragraph (15) of subsection (b), the county election officer shall send the
12 application to the applicant at the postal delivery address given on the
13 application, by nonforwardable mail, with a notice of incompleteness.
14 The notice shall specify a period of time during which the applicant may
15 complete the application in accordance with K.S.A. 25-2311, and
16 amendments thereto, and be eligible to vote in the next election.

17 (l) *The county election officer or the secretary of state's office shall*
18 *accept any completed application for registration, but an applicant shall*
19 *not be registered until the voter's application is accompanied by*
20 *satisfactory evidence of a person's eligibility to vote. Upon the ability of*
21 *the county officer or secretary of state's office to verify United States*
22 *citizenship by obtaining Kansas driver's license numbers, Kansas*
23 *nondriver's identification card numbers or social security numbers*
24 *electronically, the county election officer or secretary of state shall reject*
25 *any application for voter registration where satisfactory evidence of*
26 *United States citizenship cannot be verified.*

27 Sec. 5. K.S.A. 25-2352 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-
28 2352. (a) (1) Each Kansas division of motor vehicles driver's license
29 application and nondriver identification card application (including any
30 renewal application) submitted to a division of motor vehicles office in
31 Kansas shall serve as an application for voter registration unless the
32 applicant fails to sign the voter registration application. An individual
33 who completes the application for voter registration and is otherwise
34 eligible shall be registered to vote in accordance with the information
35 supplied by the individual.

36 (2) An application for voter registration submitted under subsection
37 (a)(1) shall be considered as updating any previous voter registration by
38 the applicant.

39 (b) The voter registration section of the application:

40 (1) May require a second signature or other information that
41 duplicates, or is in addition to, information in the driver's license or
42 nondriver's identification card section of the application to prevent
43 duplicate voter registrations, and to enable Kansas election officials to

1 assess the eligibility of the applicant and to administer voter registration
2 and other parts of the election process;

3 (2) shall include a statement that specifies each eligibility
4 requirement for voting, contains an attestation that the applicant meets
5 each such requirement, including citizenship, and requires the signature
6 of the applicant, under penalty of perjury;

7 (3) shall include a statement that, if an applicant declines to register
8 to vote, the fact that the applicant has declined to register will remain
9 confidential and will be used only for voter registration purposes;

10 (4) shall include a statement that if an applicant does register to vote,
11 the office at which the applicant submits a voter registration application
12 will remain confidential and will be used only for voter registration
13 purposes;

14 (5) shall be made available by the division of vehicles (as submitted
15 by the applicant, or in machine-readable or other format) to the secretary
16 of state and county election officers, as provided by rules and regulations
17 adopted by the secretary of state; and

18 (6) shall be transmitted to the county election officer not later than
19 five days after the date of acceptance.

20 (c) The motor vehicle driver's license and nondriver identification
21 card form used for change of residence address shall also serve as a
22 notification of change of residence address for voter registration for
23 elections, unless the registrant states on the form that the change is not for
24 voter registration purposes.

25 (d) The voter registration portion of the motor vehicle driver's
26 license and nondriver identification card applications and change of
27 address forms used shall be subject to approval by the secretary of state
28 for purposes of voter registration under this section.

29 (e) Following the line fixed for the signature of the applicant on the
30 application for voter registration, a statement shall be printed stating that
31 the penalty for submission of a false voter registration application is a
32 maximum presumptive sentence of 17 months in prison.

33 (f) *The department of revenue or an employee of the department of*
34 *revenue acting within the scope of the employee's employment shall not*
35 *be liable for any damages resulting from any claim based on the*
