

**SENATE BILL No. 390**

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1 AN ACT concerning farm wineries; relating to farm winery license;  
2 authority of licensee; amending K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 41-308a and  
3 repealing the existing section.  
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5 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

6 Section 1. K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 41-308a is hereby amended to read as  
7 follows: 41-308a. (a) A farm winery license shall allow:

8 (1) The manufacture of domestic table wine and domestic fortified  
9 wine in a quantity not exceeding 100,000 gallons per year and the storage  
10 thereof;

11 (2) the sale of wine, manufactured by the licensee, to licensed wine  
12 distributors, retailers, clubs, drinking establishments, holders of temporary  
13 permits as authorized by K.S.A. 41-2645, and amendments thereto, and  
14 caterers;

15 (3) the sale, on the licensed premises *and at special events monitored*  
16 *and regulated by the division of alcoholic beverage control* in the original  
17 unopened container to consumers for consumption off the licensed  
18 premises, of wine manufactured by the licensee;

19 (4) the serving free of charge on the licensed premises and at special  
20 events, monitored and regulated by the division of alcoholic beverage  
21 control, of samples of wine manufactured by the licensee or imported  
22 under subsection (f), if the *licensed* premises are located in a county where  
23 the sale of alcoholic liquor is permitted by law in licensed drinking  
24 establishments;

25 (5) ~~if the licensee manufactured the wine, the sale of wine~~  
26 ~~manufactured by the licensee for consumption on the licensed premises, if~~  
27 ***provided, the licensed premises are located in a county where the sale of***  
28 ***alcoholic liquor is permitted by law in licensed drinking establishments.***  
29 ***Wine sold pursuant to this paragraph shall not be subject to the***  
30 ***provisions of the club and drinking establishment act, K.S.A. 41-2601 et***  
31 ***seq., and amendments thereto, and no drinking establishment license***  
32 ***shall be required to make such sales;***

33 (5) (6) if the licensee is also licensed as a club or drinking  
34 establishment, the sale of domestic wine, domestic fortified wine and other

1 alcoholic liquor for consumption on the licensed premises as authorized by  
2 the club and drinking establishment act;

3 ~~(6)~~ (7) if the licensee is also licensed as a caterer, the sale of domestic  
4 wine, domestic fortified wine and other alcoholic liquor for consumption  
5 on the unlicensed premises as authorized by the club and drinking  
6 establishment act;

7 ~~(7)~~ (8) the sale and shipping, in the original unopened container, to  
8 consumers outside this state of wine manufactured by the licensee,  
9 provided that the licensee complies with applicable laws and rules and  
10 regulations of the jurisdiction to which the wine is shipped; and

11 ~~(8)~~ (9) the sale and shipping of wine within this state pursuant to a  
12 permit issued pursuant to K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 41-350, and amendments  
13 thereto.

14 (b) Upon application and payment of the fee prescribed by K.S.A. 41-  
15 310, and amendments thereto, by a farm winery licensee, the director may  
16 issue not to exceed three winery outlet licenses to the farm winery  
17 licensee. A winery outlet license shall allow:

18 (1) The sale, on the licensed premises *and at special events*  
19 *monitored and regulated by the division of alcoholic beverage control* in  
20 the original unopened container to consumers for consumption off the  
21 licensed premises, of wine manufactured by the licensee;

22 (2) the serving on the licensed premises of samples of wine  
23 manufactured by the licensee or imported under subsection (f), if the  
24 premises are located in a county where the sale of alcoholic liquor is  
25 permitted by law in licensed drinking establishments; and

26 (3) the manufacture of domestic table wine and domestic fortified  
27 wine and the storage thereof; provided, that the aggregate quantity of wine  
28 produced by the farm winery licensee, including all winery outlets, shall  
29 not exceed 100,000 gallons per year.

30 (c) Not less than ~~60%~~ ~~40%~~ **60%** of the products utilized in the  
31 manufacture of domestic table wine and domestic fortified wine by a farm  
32 winery shall be grown in Kansas except when a lesser proportion is  
33 authorized by the director based upon the director's findings and judgment.  
34 The label of domestic wine and domestic fortified wine shall indicate that  
35 a majority of the products utilized in the manufacture of the wine at such  
36 winery were grown in Kansas.

37 (d) A farm winery or winery outlet may sell domestic wine and  
38 domestic fortified wine in the original unopened container to consumers  
39 for consumption off the licensed premises at any time between 6 a.m. and  
40 12 midnight on any day except Sunday and between 12 noon and 6 p.m.  
41 on Sunday. If authorized by subsection (a), a farm winery may serve  
42 samples of ~~domestic wine, domestic fortified wine and wine manufactured~~  
43 *by the licensee and wine imported under subsection (e) and serve and sell*

1 domestic wine, domestic fortified wine and other alcoholic liquor for  
2 consumption on the licensed premises at any time when a club or drinking  
3 establishment is authorized to serve and sell alcoholic liquor. If authorized  
4 by subsection (b), a winery outlet may serve samples of domestic wine,  
5 domestic fortified wine and wine imported under subsection (e) at any  
6 time when the winery outlet is authorized to sell domestic wine and  
7 domestic fortified wine.

8 (e) The director may issue to the Kansas state fair or any bona fide  
9 group of grape growers or wine makers a permit to import into this state  
10 small quantities of wines. Such wine shall be used only for bona fide  
11 educational and scientific tasting programs and shall not be resold. Such  
12 wine shall not be subject to the tax imposed by K.S.A. 41-501, and  
13 amendments thereto. The permit shall identify specifically the brand and  
14 type of wine to be imported, the quantity to be imported, the tasting  
15 programs for which the wine is to be used and the times and locations of  
16 such programs. The secretary shall adopt rules and regulations governing  
17 the importation of wine pursuant to this subsection and the conduct of  
18 tasting programs for which such wine is imported.

19 (f) A farm winery license or winery outlet license shall apply only to  
20 the premises described in the application and in the license issued and only  
21 one location shall be described in the license.

22 (g) No farm winery or winery outlet shall:

23 (1) Employ any person under the age of 18 years in connection with  
24 the manufacture, sale or serving of any alcoholic liquor;

25 (2) permit any employee of the licensee who is under the age of 21  
26 years to work on the licensed premises at any time when not under the on-  
27 premise supervision of either the licensee or an employee of the licensee  
28 who is 21 years of age or over;

29 (3) employ any person under 21 years of age in connection with  
30 mixing or dispensing alcoholic liquor; or

31 (4) employ any person in connection with the manufacture or sale of  
32 alcoholic liquor if the person has been convicted of a felony.

33 (h) Whenever a farm winery or winery outlet licensee is convicted of  
34 a violation of the Kansas liquor control act, the director may revoke the  
35 licensee's license and order forfeiture of all fees paid for the license, after a  
36 hearing before the director for that purpose in accordance with the  
37 provisions of the Kansas administrative procedure act.

38 (i) This section shall be part of and supplemental to the Kansas liquor  
39 control act.
