SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2546

As Amended by House Committee on Local Government

Brief*

HB 2546 would transfer the Horton Armory property from the Kansas military board to the City of Horton. This transfer would be at no cost to the City of Horton.

Background

Representative Garber and the City Attorney for Horton testified in favor of the bill. There were no opponents or neutral testimony. The testimony stated that when the Kansas National Guard Armories were closed, most armories were transferred to their respective cities. The exception was the Horton Armory, because of how the Horton Armory originally was transferred to the military board. Originally, the Horton Armory property was transferred from a private citizen. In order to legally transfer the Horton Armory property to the city, the military board needs legislative authority.

The House Local Government Committee amended the bill to change the word "sale" in line 25 to "transfer" to reflect the fact that no sale is taking place in this transaction.

According to the fiscal note prepared by the Division of the Budget, this transfer would have no fiscal effect.
