
February 13, 2013 Office of the Governor

The Governor is the chief executive officer of the State of Kansas, elected with the Lieutenant Governor to a four-year term. Article 1 of the *Kansas Constitution* vests the Governor with the chief executive power of the state. Various enactments of the Legislature and court interpretations have qualified, specified, and expanded this role. General powers of the Governor are found in Articles 1 and 31 of Chapter 75 of the *Kansas Statutes Annotated*. Appointing and supervisory powers and duties are found throughout various statutes.



The Office of the Governor has several programs which serve the needs of the Governor in fulfilling his executive duties. Currently, there are 33.00 "regular" staff members and five temporary staff members in the agency as a whole.

Kansas Governor's Grants Program (KGGP)

The Federal and Other Grants Program (Kansas Governor's Grants Program -- KGGP) is responsible for the administration of federal and state grants to state and local units of government, community, and faith-based organizations. These grant programs are intended to enhance the criminal justice system, improve public safety, support crime victim services and drug and violence prevention programs throughout Kansas. The essential core functions of the KGGP are to:

- Manage federal and state grants received by the Kansas Governor's Grants Program to ensure financial, evaluative, and programmatic compliance with federal and state requirements.
- Distribute grants to state and local government entities, non-profit organizations, and other entities based on grant proposals that meet grant guidelines.
- Ensure subgrantee compliance with federal and state grant requirements by providing programmatic and financial oversight of subgrantee's grant projects. Conduct compliance reviews for all subgrants, provide annual training on federal and state grant requirements, and provide technical assistance.

The initial responsibility for evaluation lies with the subgrantee, and through compliance reviews for each grant awarded, the KGGP ensures that the evaluation plan is being followed, that performance outcomes set out in the grant application are being met, and that the subgrantee is in compliance with federal and state reporting requirements. In addition, grant requirements provide that various statistics about the subgrantee's projects be reported on at least an annual basis, and the majority of federal grants require quarterly reports.
