HB 2052- Gun Discharge Bill.

Dear Chairman Siegfried and committee members,

I will start with a little background information to explain why this important legislation needs to go forward.

Some of you may be asking yourselves why this legislation is needed. Most cities in our state currently have an ordinance against the discharging of a firearm within the city limits. This is understandable and I presume the purpose is to prevent people shooting their guns on New Year's Eve etc. HB 2052 merely creates an official exception for the purpose of self—defense and would ensure that law abiding citizens would feel safe while under the extreme duress of having to protect themselves and their family members. Most states in America have this exception already in effect. For some unknown reason Kansas does not currently have this exception on the books. It is conceivable that Kansas citizens could be charged with a crime by someone that is anti-gun rights. Our constitution clearly provides the right to self-defense. This bill would better align Kansas with our state constitution which says that citizens have a right to bear arms for the purpose of defense for self and family.

In the end, status quo is at best vague and open to interpretation so I urge you to sympathize with the citizens that want to know the law provides them with a secure layer of protection.
